- (b) The officer performing the current duties of the Authority competent to impose penalties under Rule 11 of the CCS (CCA) Rules (who was on leave) cleared a file correctly imposing a minor penalty on a delinquent officer.

- (c) A Central Government servant participated in a musical program arranged by the All India Radio on a non-working day and accepted the honorarium paid by the organization without informing his office.
- (d) A Government servant has received permission from the competent authority under SR11 to undertake part-time job of a lecturer in an educational institution. Does she need to also obtain the sanction of the Government in terms of Rule 15 of the CCS (Conduct) Rules, 1964, before accepting the assignment? Why?
- 2. (a) Briefly explain the provisions of rules that apply to a Government servant who is recalled to duty while on leave outside India.
