# **Additional Eligibility Criteria**

As per the University of Delhi notification [No.Aca-1/2011-12] dated 19<sup>th</sup> April 2011, the Admission Committee has finalized the additional eligibility criteria for Under-Graduate Courses.

Indraprastha College for Women will be admitting students to the Under Graduate Program (2011-14), in the following Courses to be taught in the module approved by the University of Delhi:-

- B.Com Honors
- B.Sc (Hons) Mathematics/ Computer Science Honors,
- B.A. Hons in Economics / English / Hindi / History / Philosophy / Political Science / Psychology / Sanskrit.
- B.A. Program.
- B.A (Hons) in Mass Media and Mass Communication (entrance test)

## General Decisions on Eligibility Criteria

- The aggregate marks for determining the eligibility of candidates will be calculated
  on the basis of any one core language, (unless otherwise specified as requirement
  by individual departments), from those listed in the University Bulletin along with
  three Elective subjects in the qualifying Examination
- Since the three streams, Humanities, Science and Commerce have and show a differential scoring ability in the Board Exam, College departments will also give weightage to the particular subjects/ skill sets, that contribute to enhanced understanding and performance in the course offered.
- 3. The respective departments of the College, out of the following subjects listed under the Academic stream in the University Bulletin 2010, will select any one, depending upon its value/relation to the main subject, for calculating the four best subjects. The list is as follows
  - Home Science
  - Fine Arts / Painting
  - Agriculture
  - Physical Education

- Music
- Dance
- Entrepreneurship
- Engineering Drawing / Mechanical Drawing
- Informatics Practices
- Fashion-Studies {only for B.A. program}
- Computer-Science / Computer
- Application / Web & Multi-media
- Environmental Studies\*\* / Education / Science
   (\*\*Environmental Studies of ICSE Board will be at par with other discipline subjects.)

### **Eligibility Criteria of Departments**

### **Honours Courses**

\*For English Hons., the eligibility criteria are listed on Page No 3.

### **Computer Science**

- The Cut off percentage for non-science (non-PCM) students would be 5% higher than science (PCM) students.
- The aggregate percentage will be computed on the basis of three elective subjects, one of which can be English elective (not English core).
- A student should have at least 80% marks (separately) in mathematics in class XII. **Rationale:** B.Sc. (H) Computer Science has several papers in Mathematics. A student is therefore expected to have a strong mathematical and logical background so that he/she does not find it difficult to cope with the course.
- 4 Only Informatics Practices/Computers/Web & multimedia will be considered.

### **B.COM**

For both general and OBC categories of students, the department has the following criteria:

- 1. At least 60% marks in English in Class XII board examinations
  - Rationale: This is required as teaching of B.com. (Hons), in the College is done in English medium. Besides, the syllabus for the Undergraduate Course has a 75 marks paper on Business communication that is taught in English.
- 2. At least 70 % marks in mathematics in class XII Board Examinations.

Rationale: This is considered essential as B.com (Hons) students will be doing papers on Business Mathematics and Business Statistics. Knowledge of Mathematics is essential to facilitate the grasp of subject content in other papers as well.

- 3. One of the following options from the academic streams may also be considered while calculating the Aggregate marks for the best of four subjects as they have related contents for the B.Com.(Hons) syllabus.
  - Entrepreneurship
  - Informatics practices
  - · Computer Science / computer applications / Web and multi-media.

#### **Economics**

1. The department will differentiate between Science, Humanities and Commerce streams. The aggregate marks requirement for Science and humanities will be lower than that of Commerce. Rationale: The rigorous training in logical and analytical thinking for Science Stream students is an

asset that helps them perform in Economics but may not get reflected in the results.

• The Humanities are not as scoring as Commerce.

However the percentage differential will be decided only after the Class XII Results are declared for the ICSC and CBSE.

- 2. The Essential criteria are 70% in English and 75% in Mathematics for General category students and 68% in English and 73 % in mathematics for the OBC category of students. The justification is as follows:
- All text books and reading materials for Economics-Honours are primarily available in English Therefore a high comprehension level is required in the language.
- Teaching is only in English
- The Course has a strong mathematical orientation and component. A sound knowledge of the mathematical and statistical tools is required to grasp and analyze the subject matter.

However Mathematics may or may not be included in the best of four subjects for computation of eligibility.

Only one of the following subjects related to Economics may be considered in the best Four.

- Entrepreneurship
- Engineering Drawing / Mechanical Drawing
- Informatics practices
- Computer Science / Computer applications / Web-multi media.
- Environmental studies / Education / Science

#### English

- Admission to BA(H) English in 2011 would be on the basis of performance in the CATE 2011.
- Eligibility Criteria for taking the CATE have been determined by the university as follows:

i) An aggregate of 60% in the best 4 subjects in class XII exams.

ii) 60% in English

- The sale and receipt of CATE application forms would be from 16th May to 25th May 2011, at various registration centres across the university, including I.P. College.
- The CATE is scheduled on 5th June 2011, from 2 pm to 3.30 pm.
- Admission Cut-offs to be decided by the college on the basis of the CATE Consolidated score sheet published by the University of Delhi.

# **Hindi**

Department suggest the following criteria:

70% in Hindi for General and OBC Category

**Rationale:** To study literature, it is necessary for a student to have some essential qualification. A minimum of 70% marks is necessary for a satisfactory knowledge of Hindi language & grammar. Any One subject from the subject list on Page 1.

# History

1. The History Department will consider any one of the above mentioned list of Academic subjects among the best three elective subjects (for determining aggregate marks)

Rationale: The course content of the subjects listed above provides the students with technical training, but does not necessarily equip and sensitize them to study an honors course in history.

2. Students who have secured 80% and above marks in history will get a benefit of 1% in the total aggregate marks.

Rationale: The second rider gives benefit to those students who have shown excellence in performance in the subject of history.

# **Mathematics**

- Best Four subjects will be considered as per the practice of university rule, that is one language and Three
  best electives.
- The Three best electives must include Mathematics as one of the main subjects. Being the main subject, marks in mathematics will be considered essential for Eligibility. The minimum marks required in mathematics will be decided on the basis of CBSE results.
- At least 50% marks is required in English language (core or elective; whatever maybe) as the medium of
  instruction in B.Sc. (H) Mathematics, in college, is English.
- 5% relaxation may be given, in Mathematics marks, to an OBC student.
