



## Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Patiala



### ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law (RGNUL), Punjab was established by the State Legislature of Punjab by passing the Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law Punjab Act, 2006 (Punjab Act No. 12 of 2006). RGNUL started functioning from its Headquarters - Mohindra Kothi, the Mall, Patiala w.e.f. 26 May 2006. The University acquired approval of the Bar Council of India (BCI) in August 2006. The University got registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 also got recognition under Section 12-B of the said Act. The RGNUL is regular member of Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi and several other prestigious national and international institutions/organizations.

Presently, RGNUL is carrying on academic as well as administrative activities from a heritage building of the erstwhile Patiala State, that is, Mohindra Kothi, located in the heart of Patiala city in a pollution free environment. Keeping in view the requirements of a National University of Law, necessary infrastructure has been developed at this location in the form of classrooms, lecture halls, computer labs, library, reading hall, health centre, gymnasium and other facilities. There are separate buildings as Administrative Block, Academic Block, Library, Guest House, Mess Hall, Canteen, etc.

The main campus of the University is coming up at Sidhuwal, Bhadson Road, Patiala in an area of 50 Acres of land. A state-of-the-art Campus will have an Administrative-cum-Academic Block, separate spacious Library Building, Auditorium, Sports Complex, Boys and Girls Hostels, Guest House, Community Hall, Health Centre, Residences, Stadium and other facilities. The construction and furnishing of Hostels is complete and all RGNUL Boys and Girls students are residing at the new Campus with modern amenities including air conditioning of each room. Faculty member are also residing in their apartments at the New Campus.

RGNUL has a well equipped computerized Central Library with twenty four thousand titles and about two thousand other academic documents in addition to the specialized libraries of our various Research Centres. There are two advanced Computer Labs with 60 computers and leased line internet connectivity. The whole RGNUL Campus is wi-fi enabled which is also extended to the respective hostels round the clock.

The University has also set up Centres of Advanced Study at its campus. These are: **Centre for Advanced Study in Criminal Law (CASCL)**; **Centre for Consumer Protection Law and Advocacy (CCPLA)**; **Centre for Advanced Study in International Humanitarian Law (CASH)**; **School of Agricultural Law and Economics (SALE)**; **RGNUL Institute of Competitive Examination (RICE)**, **Centre for Advanced Study in Human Rights (CASHR)** and **Directorate of Distance Education (DODE)**, **Centre for Advanced Study in Labour Welfare (CASLW)**.

The School of Law of the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), New Delhi has set up a Programme Study Centre at RGNUL, Patiala. RGNUL Legal Aid Clinic has also been established at the RGNUL Campus under the aegis of Punjab State Legal Services Authority. The University has entered in MoU with many National / International institutes for academic collaboration.

### FIVE-YEAR INTEGRATED B.A.LL.B. (HONS.) COURSE

RGNUL offers B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Five-Year Integrated Programme where under Social Science subjects like Economics, History, Political Science and Sociology are taught as major and minor subjects along with English, a Foreign Language and Law subjects in the first three years of study. All subjects are compulsory in the first three years of study. However, in the fourth and fifth year, students are offered specializations in four streams, viz., Business Law, Criminal Law, Constitutional Law and International Law. The successful students are awarded Honours Degree with specialization.

RGNUL follows the Semester System. The teaching methodology includes extensive and intensive class room teaching with emphasis on participative learning. The Courses include assignments, seminars and project work. The thrust of the course is not just on learning but also professional training.

#### Eligibility for Admission:

The admission shall be based exclusively on merit in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). However, to be eligible to appear in CLAT-2013, a candidate should have obtained a Senior Secondary School/Intermediate (10+2) or its equivalent certificate from a recognised Board with not less than 45% marks in aggregate (40% in case of SC/ST candidates) and should be below 20 years of age as on 1st July 2013 (22 years in case of SC/ST candidates).

Candidates appearing in or awaiting results of the qualifying examination held or being held in March/April 2013 may also apply and appear in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) provisionally, subject to the condition that they shall produce the proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed percentage of marks at the time of their interview/counseling.

The candidature of those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks and/or fail to produce result on the date of interview/counseling, or those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject in the qualifying examination, shall be cancelled and subsequent securing qualifying marks shall not be considered in any case.

Candidates applying in the SC/ST and Person with disability category are required to submit category certificate from the competent authority.

### Intake and Reservation:

The total number of seats for the B.A., LL.B.(Hons.) Five-Years Integrated Course shall be One Hundred and Twenty (120). Division of the seats shall be as under:

**TWO-YEAR LL. M. COURSE**

The RGNUL offers two-year LL.M. Post Graduation Course with specialization in Business Law, Constitutional Law, Criminal Law and International Law. (Specialization will be offered subject to the condition of minimum five students opting the same)

**Eligibility for Admission:**

The Admission shall be based exclusively on merit in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). The candidate must have passed the LL.B./B.L. Degree examination from Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law or any other University whose degrees are recognized by this University, with minimum 55% marks (50% marks for SC/ST candidates) shall be eligible for admission to the course.

Candidates appearing in/awaiting results of the qualifying examination being held in April/May 2013 may also apply and appear provisionally for the Admission Test, subject to the condition that they shall produce the proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed marks at the time of interview/counseling. However, the candidature of those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks and/or fail to produce result on the date of interview/counseling, or those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject in the qualifying examination, shall be cancelled and subsequent securing qualifying marks shall not be considered in any case.

Candidates applying in the SC/ST and Person With Disability (PWD) category are required to submit category certificate from the competent authority.
