INTRODUCTION

National Institute of Design, Kurukshetra, was established on November 15, 2016 as an autonomous institute under the Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India.

National Institute of Design, Kurukshetra, offers a wide spectrum in design education while encouraging transdisciplinary learning by doing. NID Kurukshetra's transdisciplinary environment consisting of diverse design domains helps in creating an innovative and holistic ecosystem for design learning and delivering solutions focusing on the emerging needs of people, integrated with digital and cutting edge technologies.

The Institute's full-fledged campus with state of art facilities is coming up in Kurukshetra, Haryana. Not only are the workshops set up for making models and prototypes, but they are capable in certain cases of fair sized production runs. Since its inception, the institute has been functioning from its transit campus located in Umri, Kurukshetra adjacent to Shri Vardhman City and upcoming campus of NID Kurukshetra.

GRADUATE PROGRAM

The overall structure of Graduate Diploma Programme in Design (GDPD) at NID Kurukshetra is a combination of theory, skill, design projects and field experience supported by cutting edge Design Studios, Workshops, Innovation Labs and a Knowledge Management Centre facilitated by mentors from domain experts. NID Kurukshetra currently offers full-time four year Graduate Diploma in Design with specialisation streams in :-
INDUSTRIAL DESIGN,
COMMUNICATION DESIGN,
TEXTILE AND APPAREL DESIGN,
with a multi-disciplinary approach to design.

The Graduate Diploma Program in Design (GDPD) commences with a two semester rigorous Foundation year followed by 6 semesters of specialized courses.

FOUNDATION YEAR

The one-year Foundation Program introduces students to the fundamentals of design and helps develop ways of perception, aesthetic sensitivity, understanding of the multidisciplinary nature of design and relationship of design with human senses and emotions, culture, environment and ecology.

Basic design studio courses are augmented by introductory studies in Humanities. This allows the students to develop a world view, understanding of the Indian milieu and the socio-cultural context for Design to operate. The varied inputs over two semesters provide the necessary direction, stimuli, facilities and experience to foster creativity and thereby help each individual discover their own identity and potential. The Foundation Program is the basis on which the remaining design curriculum is built.

INDUSTRIAL DESIGN

Industrial design is concerned primarily with the relationship between industries, systems and those who use them. Responsibility and concern towards the social, physical and ecological environments is emphasized in the process of developing innovative ideas. The Industrial Design faculty assimilates inputs in diverse domains such as human factors, cognitive ergonomics, form studies, studio skills, advanced CAD, research methods, design management, materials and manufacturing processes and social sciences. Emphasis is on process centric approach that shapes a student's education through participation and teamwork. Design projects form the core of an Industrial Designer's education and cover broad areas that Industrial designers are likely to encounter in their professional careers.

COMMUNICATION DESIGN

Visual communication design as a programme, combines the knowledge of subjective and objective in a way that fulfills the purpose of communication. NID Kurukshetra offers this discipline in a way that enables the students to explore the subdomains of “visual” communication in the same course duration. During their period of study, students in communication design are encouraged to work on a variety of projects, majoring in the selected subdomain of communication design. A student, in addition to a thorough grounding in design abilities and theoretical aspects, emerging global trends, undertakes the study of the cultural and historical context in which designers need to function as well as of the social and ethical factors that influence design decisions.

TEXTILE AND APPAREL DESIGN

TEXTILE AND APPAREL DESIGN

The Textile and Apparel Design Faculty strives to develop innovative and synergetic approaches to design for diverse sectors of the textile & apparel industry, markets and the social sector. Informed by an appreciation of the cultural heritage, socioeconomic, ethical and environmental concerns. Creative explorations from concept to prototype are encouraged. The emphasis is on building a variety of skills, in combination with theoretical knowledge and practical application. This includes textile fibers, weave structure, surface design, dyeing techniques, printing methods, sewing techniques, constructed textiles and basic inputs in garment design. The program includes several interdisciplinary projects of designing textiles and apparel for Public Spaces, Exhibition, Interiors and for the Automobile industry.





INFRASTRUCTURE

The interdependence between design and production is deemed essential at NID Kurukshetra. The infrastructure consists of well equipped department workshops, Information Technology Labs with latest softwares, a Knowledge Management Centre that houses a variety of reference material like books, journals, periodicals and films. In addition, the Audio Visual hall facilitates periodic film screening and guest lectures.

Rigorous practice lays foundation for acquiring skills, know-how and familiarity required to understand production methods. Students have access to Laser Cutting machines and MakerBot 3D printers providing a comprehensive knowledge regarding the technicalities and details of a design.



DEPARTMENT WORKSHOPS


The workshop infrastructure is equipped with latest machines, tools and equipments in wood, metal, ceramics, textiles, photography and filmmaking to facilitate learning about technological processes.

ADMISSION PROCESS & FEES STRUCTURE

SELECTION PROCESS

NID Kurukshetra invites application for the fourth batch for its 4-year Graduate Diploma Program in Design (GDPD) for the academic year 2019-20. Students are admitted through centralized DAT. Based on the scores obtained in this test, candidates are shortlisted and called for the second phase.

Design Aptitude Test

The Design Aptitude Test (DAT) shall be conducted for short-listing applicants for studio test at various centres.

Studio Test

Candidates short-listed after the DAT will be invited to appear for studio test and shall be short-listed for admission based on merit.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The institute currently offers a full time four year graduate diploma programme in design (GDPD) with specialisation in mentioned streams with an inter disciplinary approach to design education.
