

Scholarships Terms & Conditions

The following terms and conditions are applicable to all undergraduate and postgraduate scholarship and bursary awards (an "Award") made to students and administered by the Anglia Ruskin University Higher Education Corporation ("Anglia Ruskin University"). In accepting any Award in accordance with these conditions, a student enters into a binding contract with Anglia Ruskin University and thus agree to be legally bound by (1) the provisions of the Terms and Conditions herein; and (2) any specific additional Terms and Conditions which may be applicable to an Award of which a student may be notified by the University from time to time; (together "this Agreement"). In the event of any conflict between these Terms and Conditions and any specific additional Terms and Conditions which a student is notified by the University are applicable to particular Award, the latter terms shall take precedence.

It is a student's responsibility as Awardee to ensure he or she fully understands and is familiar with all terms and conditions associated with their Award, and that at all times, they remain in full compliance with such terms. Any failure to do so may put the student at risk of losing future Award payments, and/or being required by the Anglia Ruskin University to repay any payments of their Award that they may already have received prior to any such breach.

All Awards are awarded on the basis that the relevant student maintains an enrolled status in their course of study.

General Terms & Conditions

Program Eligibility

- To be eligible for Anglia Ruskin University Scholarships, students
 must be studying either a full time bachelor degree undergraduate
 programme or postgraduate taught or research programme at our
 Chelmsford, Cambridge or Peterborough campuses.
- CPD programmess, Foundation degrees, Extended degrees, Degree Apprenticeships, Distance Learning and/or short courses are ineligible for all scholarships
- Additional eligibility criteria for each scholarship is available in this document and should be read in conjunction with the general terms and conditions.
- In addition to meeting the eligibility requirements and terms and conditions of the scholarship award, all scholarship recipients must also meet any conditions attached to their academic offer from Anglia Ruskin University, and must comply with all visa and immigration requirements. In the event that a student is subsequently unable to meet and comply with any such academic, visa and/or immigration conditions for any reason, Anglia Ruskin University reserves the right to withdraw an Award with immediate effect, and to terminate this Agreement without any liability to the student, whatsoever. The decision as to whether any Awardee is deemed to have made satisfactory progress on their programme of study to receive payment of any Award shall be made at Anglia Ruskin University's sole discretion.

- It is a requirement of an Award that the student fully registers and is enrolled on their programme of study within three (3) weeks of the programme's published start date, and that the student remains so for the duration of their Award. Where a student fails to register on their programme of study on expiry of three (3) weeks following their programme's published start date Anglia Ruskin University reserves the right to withdraw the Award with immediate effect, and to terminate this Agreement without any liability to the student, whatsoever. No payment of any award or part thereof shall be made until the student is fully registered with Anglia Ruskin University.
- In the event that a student is required to repeat an academic year of study for any reason, the student shall not be entitled to receive any Award during such repeat year of study. At the sole discretion of Anglia Ruskin University and only where applicable, Award payments may recommence once the student has been approved by Anglia Ruskin University to progress to the next level of study, and the student is subsequently deemed by Anglia Ruskin University to be making satisfactory progress.
- In the event that a student is prevented from studying by ill-health or other circumstance (for example bereavement, pregnancy or other circumstance) for a continuous period of two (2) weeks or more, they are required to immediately inform their supervisor (personal tutor, student advisor or other University contact as appropriate) and provide a valid medical certificate or appropriate documentation confirming the reason for any absence. The student should be aware that any sustained period of absence from their studies may impact on their eligibility to continue receive their Award. Where a circumstance prevents study for a period in excess of two (2) weeks, a concession may have to be raised, or a suspension of studies sought, which may in-turn affect their registration status and their eligibility to continue to receive payment of their Award.

Eligibility for multiple scholarships

- Students eligible for multiple scholarships at Anglia Ruskin University
 will be entitled to receive only one, to the highest value for duration
 of each level of study, e.g. one scholarship for their undergraduate
 study, one scholarship for their postgraduate taught study and one for
 postgraduate research study.
- Students who are eligible for the Home/EU student alumni scholarship when undertaking postgraduate taught or research study will be eligible to receive one additional scholarship to receive a maximum of - the alumni scholarship + 1 scholarship.
- International students who receive the alumni scholarship are not eligible to receive any other scholarship.

Assessment of Eligibility

 Students must ensure that all information is provided and application forms are completed in full to be eligible to be considered for Anglia Ruskin University Scholarships. Decisions on the award of a scholarship shall be made by a panel selected by Anglia Ruskin University at its sole discretion (the "scholarship panel"). The scholarship panel's decision to award a scholarship shall be based on the eligibility criteria and exclusions specified for each scholarship. Unless otherwise specified in such criteria, decisions of the panel shall be based on academic achievements, motivation to study at ARU, completed application form where required and such other criteria as the panel deems appropriate.

Applicant and Scholarship Recipient Communications

- Post submitting an application students will receive confirmation of receipt via an email reply.
- Students will be advised via the email address given to ARU on their application form the outcome of their application. The instalments in which a student receives their Award shall be as specified by Anglia Ruskin University and are non-negotiable.
- Students eligible for the alumni, merit, International merit and EU scholarship are not required to submit an application from for these scholarships and will receive notification of their scholarship in their offer letter.
- Students will receive a certificate acknowledging receipt of the scholarship (except alumni, merit, International merit and EU scholarships).
- Successful scholarship recipients will be asked to participate in promotional activities which may include testimonials, participating in the student ambassador programme and other initiatives.

Withdrawal of Scholarship

- Anglia Ruskin University may (in its sole discretion) withdraw scholarships upon the following circumstances:
 - If the student has supplied incorrect or misleading information during the application process.
 - The recipient withdraws from studying at Anglia Ruskin University or discontinues at any point in the course. The student will no longer be eligible for the scholarship should they return to the course.
- Upon withdrawing the scholarship Anglia Ruskin University shall be entitled to seek repayment of any portion of an Award which may have been paid to a student, recoverable as a debt.
- Scholarship recipients must pay all tuition fees by the deadlines set by Anglia Ruskin, to the extent that such fees are not covered by the scholarship. Non-payment of these remaining fees will result in the scholarship being withdrawn and full fees being charged by Anglia Ruskin University, in accordance with Anglia Ruskin University's terms and conditions.

Miscellaneous

- Anglia Ruskin University is subject to the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and the students receiving Awards hereby agree that nothing in these terms and conditions shall be taken to prevent Anglia Ruskin University from making any disclosure required under the provisions of this Act.
- Any personal information collected by Anglia Ruskin University during
 the course of administration of an Award shall be handled and processed
 by Anglia Ruskin University strictly in accordance with the provisions of
 the the General Data Protection Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2016/679)).
 Anglia Ruskin University reserves the right to make changes to these
 terms and conditions at any time where such a change arises as a result
 of changes in regulations or legislation affecting the Award.

- Anglia Ruskin University may unilaterally change the terms in these
 terms and conditions by giving the student at least one (1) month's
 written notice of Anglia Ruskin University's intention to do so. In the
 event that the student does not wish to accept any such revised terms,
 the student reserves the right to terminate this Agreement by written
 notice to Anglia Ruskin University.
- This Agreement shall not be assigned by either Party without the prior written consent of the other Party hereto.
- If the whole or any part of any provision of this Agreement is void
 or unenforceable in any jurisdiction, the other provisions of this
 Agreement, and the rest of the void or unenforceable provision, will
 continue in force in that jurisdiction, and the validity and enforceability
 of that provision in any other jurisdiction will not be affected.
- Nothing in this contract confers or purports to confer on any third party any right to enforce any term of this Agreement.
- This Agreement shall be interpreted according to the laws of England and Wales.

Individual Scholarship Terms & Conditions

UK (home)/EU Students

Vice-Chancellors Scholarship

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University's Vice-Chancellor's Scholarships are awarded to undergraduate students whose exceptional academic achievement and extra-curricular achievements set them apart from their peers.

Value

- £24,000 cash payment
- A cash payment of £8,000 per year spread over a 3 year period or prorata (depending on the duration of the course) paid in instalments to students at two points throughout the academic year.
- · Payments to be made via BACS to a UK bank account.

Duration

- The scholarship is awarded for the normal full time duration of the course, upon commencing at the start of the academic year for year one of a three year programme.
- Continued eligibility for this scholarship is conditional on continued satisfactory academic progress.

Key Dates

· Applications close on April 12 2019.

Eligibility

- Students should ensure they meet all criteria before submitting their application. Students should contact the Admissions Customer Service Team via (01245 686868 and/or answers@anglia.ac.uk) for any queries.
- Students must be eligible to study paying Home/EU tuition fees (a separate scholarship scheme is available for International students).
- Students studying the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery will not be eligible to apply.

- Students must be commencing an Anglia Ruskin University undergraduate degree programme offered on the Cambridge, Chelmsford and Peterborough campuses in the September Semester in the 2019 academic year. Foundation, Extended, Degree Apprenticeship and Distance Learning degree programs and/or CPD and short courses are not eligible.
- Students must be studying full time unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.
- Students must demonstrate achievement in one of the following: Achieve a tariff of AAB or above (136 points) or an equivalent entry score. Minimum of two A levels or equivalent achieved in the same year.
- · Consideration will be given to;
 - Your extra-curricular activities and achievements, for examples in the areas of leadership, community service, volunteering, sport and other fields.
 - · Students' experience, personal or financial hardship.

- Students are to submit an application via the following link Scholarships Application Form.
- Students will then be contacted to finalise their application by submitting a 500 word supporting statement outlining why they are suitable to receive this award.
- Students may be required to submit supporting documentation including:
 - Evidence of your extra-curricular activities. This would usually be via a certificate or letter from a senior member of the organisation.

- Your application will be assessed by a panel of ARU staff members and representatives from the Student Union and you will be ranked based on the details you provide in your application and supporting documentation.
- You may also be invited to attend an interview to discuss your application.

Achievement Scholarship

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University's Achievement Scholarships are awarded to eligible undergraduate students who have achieved strong academic performance in their field of study, and a commitment to extracurricular activities.

Value

- A cash payment of £2,000 in the first academic year paid to students at two points throughout the academic year.
- · Payments to be made via BACS to a UK bank account.

Duration

 Continued eligibility for this scholarship is conditional on continued satisfactory academic progress.

Key Dates

• Applications close on April 12 2019.

Eligibility

- Students should ensure they meet all criteria before submitting their application. Students should contact the Admissions Customer Service Team via (answers@anglia.ac.uk/01245 686868) for any queries.
- Students must be eligible to study paying Home/EU tuition fees (a separate scholarship scheme is available for International students).
- Commencing on an Anglia Ruskin University undergraduate degree offered on the Cambridge, Chelmsford and Peterborough campuses in the September Semester in the 2019 academic year. Foundation, Extended, Degree Apprenticeship and Distance Learning programmes and/or CPD and short courses are not eligible.

STEM Scholarship

Outline

Anglia Ruskin University's STEM Scholarship is to be awarded to eligible
undergraduate and postgraduate students choosing to study in the
areas of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. This scholarship
recognises key areas of skill shortage within the UK, and is designed to
support students interested in progressing their careers in STEM fields.

Value

- £2,000 cash payment
- A cash payment of £2,000 in the first academic year paid to students at two points throughout the academic year.
- · Payments to be made via BACS to a UK bank account.

Duration

 The scholarship is awarded for one year of the full time duration of an undergraduate course (three year programme), and one year of the full time duration of a postgraduate course.

Key Dates

· Applications close on April 12 2019.

Eligibility

- Students should ensure they meet all criteria before submitting their application. Students should contact the Admissions Customer Service Team via (answers@angla.ac.uk/ 01245 686868) for any queries.
- Students must be eligible to study paying Home/EU tuition fees (a separate scholarship scheme is available for International students).
- Students studying the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery will not be eligible to apply.
- Commencing on an Anglia Ruskin University undergraduate or postgraduate degree program in the areas as outlined below offered on the Cambridge, Chelmsford and Peterborough campuses in the September Semester in the 2019 academic year. Foundation, Extended, Degree Apprenticeship and Distance Learning programmes are not eligible.
 - · Animal Sciences
 - · Architecture, Building and Construction
 - · Computing and Digital Technology
 - · Engineering
 - Psychology
 - · Sciences, Nutritional and Pharmaceutical
 - Optometry
- Students must be studying full time unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.
- · Applicants must demonstrate achievement in one of the following:
 - Achieve the entry requirements of the undergraduate or postgraduate programme.
 - Have completed prior study, GSCE or equivalent in STEM related subjects as per the course entry requirements.
- · Consideration will be given to;
 - Your extra-curricular activities and achievements, for examples in the areas of leadership, community service, volunteering, sport and other fields with a focus on STEM.
 - · Students' experience, personal or financial hardship.

- Students will then be contacted to finalise their application by submitting a 500 word supporting statement outlining why they are suitable to receive this award.
- Students may be required to submit supporting documentation including:
 - Evidence of your extra-curricular activities via a certificate, letter from a senior member of the organisation, or other means.

Withdrawal of Scholarship

 - If the student changes course and moves to a non-STEM related field

Merit Scholarship

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University's Merit Scholarships are awarded to eligible undergraduate students who have achieved strong academic performance in their studies.

Value

- A cash payment of £1,000 in the first academic year paid to students at two points throughout the academic year.
- Students are to receive a fee discount. This will be deducted from the total fee required for payment and reflected on the remittance advice.

Duration

 Continued eligibility for this scholarship is conditional on continued satisfactory academic progress.

Eligibility

- Students will be automatically assessed as part of their application.
- Students must be eligible to study paying Home/EU tuition fees (a separate scholarship scheme is available for International students).
- Commencing on an Anglia Ruskin University undergraduate degree offered on the Cambridge, Chelmsford and Peterborough campuses in the September Semester in the 2019 academic year. Foundation, Extended, Degree Apprenticeship and Distance Learning programmes and/or CPD and short courses are excluded.
- Students studying the MBChB Medicine and MEng Civil Engineering will not be eligible to apply.
- Students must be studying full time unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.
- Achieve a tariff of BBB or above (120 points) or an equivalent entry score.
 Minimum of two A levels or equivalent achieved in the same year.

How to Apply

 Students do not need to apply for this scholarship. All eligible students will be automatically assessed.

 Students will receive confirmation of their eligibility via email upon receipt of their conditional offer.

MBA Bursary

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University's MBA Scholarship is available to students eliqible to undertake the Master of Business Administration course.

Value

- £4000 fee discount for those undertaking the non-placement course.
- £2,000 fee discount for those undertaking a placement course. For students who are not successful in gaining a placement they will be eliqible for the full £4000 discount.

Duration

· The scholarship is awarded for the first year of the course.

Eligibility

 A full time student unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.

How to Apply

 A student's eligibility will be automatically assessed from their course application form. There is no separate application process.

 Students will receive confirmation of their eligibility via email upon receipt of their conditional offer.

Alumni Scholarship (PGT and PGR)

(Home and EU fee paying students)

Outline

- Anglia Ruskin University's Alumni Scholarship is available to students
 eligible to undertake a postgraduate taught or postgraduate research
 program who have completed an Anglia Ruskin undergraduate degree
 or postgraduate degree (as outlined below) and received an Anglia
 Ruskin University Award upon completion of their degree.
- This discount applies to any student who has completed the following Anglia Ruskin University awards:
 - · Full honours degree (BA/BSc, BEng, BOptom)
 - Full Master degree (MA/MSc, MEng)
 - Postgraduate Certificate (PG Cert)
 - · Postgraduate Diploma (PG Dip)

Value

- £1000 for Anglia Ruskin University alumnus applying to study a postgraduate taught degree.
- £2000 for Anglia Ruskin University alumnus who achieved a 2:1 or above in their previous study, applying to study a postgraduate taught degree.
- £400 for Anglia Ruskin University alumnus studying a postgraduate research degree.

Students are to receive a fee discount. This will be deducted from the total fee required for payment and reflected on the remittance advice.

Duration

 The scholarship is awarded in the first year of the postgraduate taught or research degree (full time or part time).

Eligibility

- Students will be automatically assessed as part of their application.
- Students must be an Anglia Ruskin University Alumnus and be commencing a new course (a student in their first Semester of study at Anglia Ruskin University). There is no time limit on when a student completed their Anglia Ruskin University Awards (including at predecessor institutions).
- Be commencing a new postgraduate taught or research award either full time or part time.

How to Apply

 Students do not need to apply for this scholarship. All eligible students will be automatically assessed.

 Students will receive confirmation of their eligibility via email upon receipt of their conditional offer.

Partners Scholarship (PGT and PGR)

(Home and EU fee paying students)

Outline

Anglia Ruskin University's Partners Scholarship is available to students eligible to undertake a postgraduate taught or postgraduate research programme at one of our core campuses (Cambridge, Chelmsford or Peterborough). Students must have completed an Anglia Ruskin/Anglia Polytechnic University undergraduate degree or postgraduate degree and received an Anglia Ruskin University/Anglia Polytechnic University (APU) award upon completion of their degree, from 1992 onwards.

- This discount applies to any student who has completed the following Anglia Ruskin University/Anglia Polytechnic University awards:
 - Full honours degree (BA/BSc, BEng, BOptom)
 - Full Masters degree (MA/MSc, MEng)
 - Postgraduate Certificate (PG Cert)
 - Postgraduate Diploma (PG Dip)

Value

- £2000 for a student from a partner institution with an Anglia Ruskin University/Anglia Polytechnic University-validated Degree Award who achieved a 2:1 or above in their previous study, applying to study a postgraduate taught degree.
- £1000 for a student from a partner institution with an Anglia Ruskin University/Anglia Polytechnic University-validated Degree Award who achieved below a 2:1 in their previous study, applying to study a postgraduate taught degree.
- £400 for a student from a partner institution with an Anglia Ruskin University/Anglia Polytechnic University-validated Degree Award applying to study a postgraduate research degree.

Duration

 The scholarship is awarded in the first year of the postgraduate taught or research degree (full-time or part-time).

Eligibility

- · Students will automatically be assessed as part of their application.
- Students must have been awarded Anglia Ruskin University/Anglia
 Polytechnic University-validated degree from a partner institution (as
 listed above) from 1992 onwards, and be commencing a new course (a
 student in their first semester of study at Anglia Ruskin University) at
 one of our core campuses (Cambridge, Chelmsford or Peterborough).
- Students can be commencing a new postgraduate taught or research degree full-time or part-time.

How to apply

 Students do not need to apply for this scholarship. All eligible students will be automatically assessed on submission of their Anglia Ruskin University/Anglia Polytechnic University certificate.

 Students will receive confirmation of their eligibility via email upon receipt of their conditional offer.

EU Undergraduate Bursary

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University (ARU) is awarding a cash bursary to students from the EU commencing a full time undergraduate degree course* at the University for the first time in the 2019/20 academic year.

Value

 Students to receive an £800 cash payment in the first academic year paid to students at two points throughout the academic year.

Duration

 The bursary is available in the first year of undergraduate degree* study only.

Kev Dates

 In order to receive the bursary applicants must have accepted the University's offer of a place as their "firm" choice no later than 31 August 2019 (for September 2019 entry) and 30th November 2019 (for January 2020 entry).

Eligibility

- be an EU national (excluding UK)
- be ordinary resident in the EU (excluding UK) see below for the definition of ordinary residence;
- have received an offer of admission for entry to Anglia Ruskin University in the September 2018 or January 2019 intakes;
- have accepted the University's offer of a place as your UCAS firm choice no later than 31 August 2019 (for September 2019 entry) or 30 November 2019 (for January 2020 entry). Applications received via an agent will also be accepted;
- register for a full-time undergraduate degree at an Anglia Ruskin University core campus (Cambridge, Chelmsford or Peterborough) with first enrolment in 2019-20 academic year;
- be in your first year of study at the University at the start of the award.

The following students are NOT eligible for the bursary regardless of meeting the above criteria:

- Students undertaking courses at Cambridge Ruskin International College (CRIC);
- Students funded by the NHS and those studying the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery
- Students directly continuing from one course to another (for example from a Foundation degree, CRIC course or HND on to the final year of an honours degree).
- Students transferring into the second or final year from another higher education institution.

Ordinary Residence: For the purposes of assessing eligibility for the bursary, applicants must have been ordinarily resident in an EU member country (excluding UK) for the three-year period prior to commencing their course. Temporary absences during this three-year period may be permitted at the discretion of the relevant University officer. Applicants may be asked to provide documentary evidence in order to determine ordinary residence and an assessment of whether an applicant meets the ordinary residence criteria will normally be made by the Head of Admissions or his/her nominee, and his/her decision will be final.

*Undergraduate degree courses leading to the award of a Bachelor degree (3 or 4 years) or Integrated Masters (four years)

How to apply

 Students will be automatically considered based on the eligibility criteria listed above.

Find out if you are successful

 If you meet all of the above eligibility criteria you will be awarded the bursary and will be informed after the final cut off date of 31 August 2019 (for September 2019 entry) or 30 November 2019 (for January 2020 entry).

International Fee Paying Students

International Excellence Scholarship (International fee paying students)

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin International Excellence Scholarships awarded to eligible undergraduate or postgraduate students whose exceptional academic achievement and extra-curricular achievements set them apart from their peers.

Value

- £4000 fee discount to students applying for an undergraduate degree, who have achieved 'A' Level ABB grades or equivalent international qualification.
- £4000 fee discount to students applying for a postgraduate degree, who have achieved 2:1 or above or equivalent international qualification.

Duration

• The scholarship is awarded for the first year of the course.

Key Dates

- · September 2019 courses
 - Applications open on January 1 2019 for students applying to study in September 2019.
 - Applications close on July 13 2019 for students applying to study in September 2019.
 - We will notify applicants of the outcome by Monday 30 July 2019.
- January 2020 courses
 - Applications open on January 12019 for students applying to study in January 2020.
 - Applications close on November 30 2019 for students applying to study in January 2020.
 - We will notify applicants of the outcome by Monday 17 December 2019.

Eligibility

- · An international fee paying student.
- Commencing in an Anglia Ruskin University undergraduate or postgraduate taught degree program offered on the Cambridge or Chelmsford campuses in the September 2018 or January 2019. Degree apprenticeships, foundation, distance/work-based learning degrees, postgraduate certificate/diploma programs and students joining a master's with credit are excluded.
- A full time international fee paying student unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.
- · Consideration will be given to;
 - Extra-curricular activities and achievements, for example in the areas of leadership, community service, volunteering, sport and other fields.
 - Why a student has chosen the particular course and how it will contribute to their career goals
- This scholarship cannot be combined with any other scholarship or the £1000 international early payment discount.

- Students will receive confirmation of their eligibility to receive this scholarship via email sent to the email address given to ARU on their course application form.
- Students will be issued with an updated offer letter.

International Merit Scholarship

(International fee paying students)

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University's International Merit Scholarships awarded to eligible undergraduate and postgraduate students whose academic achievements set them apart from their peers.

Value

- £2000 fee discount to students applying for an undergraduate degree, who have achieved 'A' Level BBB grades or equivalent international qualification.
- £1000 fee discount to students applying for an undergraduate degree, who have achieved 'A' Level CCC grades or equivalent international qualification.
- £2000 fee discount to students who have achieved a 2:1 or above in their undergraduate degree or a distinction in a UK master's degree (or equivalent international qualification) and are applying for a postgraduate taught masters or postgraduate research degree.
- £1000 fee discount to students who have achieved a 2:2 in their undergraduate degree or a pass in a UK master's degree (or equivalent international qualification) and are applying for a postgraduate taught master's or a postgraduate research degree.

Duration

- The scholarship is awarded for the first year of the course for undergraduate and postgraduate taught degrees.
- The scholarship is awarded each year that a student pays full international fees for a maximum of three years of study for postgraduate research degrees.

Eligibility

- · An international fee paying student.
- Commencing in an Anglia Ruskin University full time undergraduate
 or postgraduate taught or research degree program offered on the
 Cambridge or Chelmsford campuses in the September 2019 or January
 2020. Degree apprenticeships, foundation, distance/work-based
 learning degrees, postgraduate certificate/diploma programs and
 students joining a master's with credit are excluded.
- Students applying for the postgraduate Diploma Legal Practice course are also eliqible for this scholarship.
- A full time international fee paying student unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.

 A student's eligibility will be automatically assessed from their course application form by the International Admissions team. There is no separate application process.

International Alumni Scholarship

(International fee paying students)

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University's International Alumni Scholarship is available to students eligible to undertake a postgraduate taught or postgraduate research program who have completed an Anglia Ruskin undergraduate degree or postgraduate degree (as outlined below) and received an Anglia Ruskin University Award upon completion of their degree.

- This discount applies to any student who has completed the following Anglia Ruskin University awards:
 - · Full honours degree (BA/BSc)
 - Full Master degree (MA/MSc)
 - · Postgraduate Certification (PG Cert)
 - · Postgraduate Diploma (PG Dip)

Value

 £3000 fee discount for Anglia Ruskin University alumnus studying at full time postgraduate taught or research degree or the PG Dip Legal Practice Course.

Duration

- The scholarship is awarded for the first year of the course for undergraduate and postgraduate taught degrees.
- The scholarship is awarded each year that a student pays full international fees for a maximum of three years of study for postgraduate research degrees.

Eligibility

- · An international fee paying student.
- Commencing an Anglia Ruskin University full time postgraduate degree program offered on the Cambridge or Chelmsford campuses in the September 2019 or January 2020.
- Distance Learning degree programs, Postgraduate Certificates or Postgraduate Diplomas are excluded.
- A full time international fee paying student unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.
- · Students joining with credit will be given a pro rata discount.
- This scholarship cannot be combined with any other scholarship or the £1000 international early payment discount.

 A student's eligibility will be automatically assessed from their course application form by the International Admissions team. There is no separate application process.

International MBA Bursary

(International fee paying students)

Outline

 Anglia Ruskin University's International MBA Scholarship is available to students eligible to undertake the Master of Business Administration course.

Value

- £4000 fee discount for those undertaking the non-placement course.
- £2,000 fee discount for those undertaking a placement course. For students who are not successful in gaining a placement they will be eligible for the full £4000 discount.

Duration

• The scholarship is awarded for the first year of the course.

Eligibility

 A full time student unless there are exceptional circumstances preventing full time study.

How to Apply

 A student's eligibility will be automatically assessed from their course application form. There is no separate application process.

International Early Payment Discount

(International fee paying students)

Outline

 Early payment discount for students applying for an undergraduate or postgraduate taught degree.

Value

• £1000 fee discount for International students.

Duration

 The discount is only applicable for first year full time international students.

Eligibility

- · A full time international fee paying student.
- To take advantage of this discount a student must pay their full tuition fees minus their International Merit Scholarship (if applicable) and minus the £1000 Early Payment Discount by the 21st July 2019 for courses beginning in September 2019 and by 30th November 2019 for courses beginning in January 2020.
- Students receiving the International Alumni Scholarship or International MBA Scholarship are not eligible for the International Early Payment Discount.

Sport Scholarship

Outline

The ARU Sport Scholarship is awarded to eligible undergraduate and
postgraduate taught students (Home/EU and International students). The
sports scholarship programme will provide support services to allow elite
athletes to develop during their time at Anglia Ruskin University, and assist
in alleviating the financial pressures associated with elite sport.

Value

- 3 Levels of Scholarship
 - Podium full Fee Scholarships covering tuition fees up to £12,500
 a year for the duration of the course as advertised. This may be
 reduced to a 50% Fee Scholarship and awarded to more than one
 athlete as long as the total cost does not exceed £12,500.
 - Elite Scholarships, up to £1400 per year.
 - Competition Scholarships up to £500 per year.

- A cash payment will be made per year spread over a 3 year period or pro-rata (depending on the duration of the course) paid in instalments to students at two points throughout the academic year.
- · Payments to be made via BACS to a UK bank account.

Podium Scholarship

Duration

- The scholarship is awarded for the normal full time duration of the programme, as advertised.
- Continued eligibility for this scholarship is conditional on students achieving a minimum of a 2.2, however the final decision on continuing eligibility is at the sole discretion of Anglia Ruskin University.

Key Dates

 Students are eligible for the Sports Scholarship up until the commencement of the academic year.

Eligibility

- National or International level athletes, Great Britain junior squad athletes or an equivalent standard from other countries.
- Athletes must be able to demonstrate they will have a significant impact on the performance of the team where appropriate.
- · Meet the entry requirements for the chosen course.

How to Apply

- Once identified athletes will be asked to complete application form via the following link https://www.anglia.ac.uk/sport/sports-scholarship providing supporting evidence to prove current playing level.
- · Applicants may be invited to interview.
- Applicants may be required to undergo a screening or submit a report from Physiotherapists or equivalent from their previous club or team.
- The successful scholarship recipients will be selected by the High Performance Sport Co-ordinator and Head of Sport.
- · All successful applicants will be notified by phone and email.

Withdrawal of Scholarship

- Failure to maintain satisfactory academic participation and results.
- Non-attendance at training and matches for an extended period of time (1 month) without communication (and approval) to coaches and key staff.
- The athlete can no longer represent Anglia Ruskin University in their sport for any reason.
- Performance / Results have significantly decreased over an extended period (reviewed each academic term) of time resulting in the athlete no longer meeting the eligibility criteria.
- The final decision will be made by the High Performance Sport Coordinator in consultation with key members of staff.

Elite and Competition

Duration

 The scholarship is awarded for the normal full time duration of the course as advertised. Continuing eligibility for the Scholarship requires the athlete to continue meeting the eligibility criteria outlined below.

Key Dates

 Applications open all year round with a review of applications in February and September.

Eligibility

- · National, Regional or County level athletes.
- Showing potential to significantly contribute to achievement of BUCS points and therefore helping our University's ranking.
- · Meet the entry requirements for the chosen course.

How to Apply

- Students are to submit the application via the following link https://www.anglia.ac.uk/sport/sports-scholarships/sport-scholarship
- Supply supporting evidence to demonstrate their current playing level and provide a reference from previous coaches.

Find out if you are successful

- Students will be assessed by a panel of staff members (3 in total) and will be assessed on the details provided in the application and supporting documentation.
- Emails will be sent to students using the email address given on their application.

Withdrawal of Scholarship

- Failure to continue satisfactory academic progress, students must receive sufficient credits to progress onto the next academic year.
- Non-attendance at training and matches for an extended period of time (1 month) without communication (and approval) to coaches and key staff
- The athlete can no longer represent Anglia Ruskin University in their sport for any given reason.
- Performance / Results have significantly decreased over an extended period of time (reviewed each academic term) resulting in the athlete no longer meeting the eligibility criteria.

Sport Specific Terms and Conditions

 The scholarship can be withdrawn if the Scholar fails to meet the terms and conditions outlined below and in the Anglia Ruskin University Scholarships Terms and Conditions.

Finance

- Scholars receiving a Fee Scholarship will have the agreed amount deducted from their tuition fees.
- Scholars will be responsible for all costs related to applying to ARU (including visas) and moving costs prior to the start of their course at ARU.
- Scholars who receive cash payments will have them paid into the account provided via BACS to a UK bank account. Payments will be made in two instalments.
- Scholar payments are to help athletes with the costs related to performance sport and should be used for this purpose.

- Scholars who are unable to provide evidence that funds have been spent as agreed with the HPSC, when requested, will have the costs added to their student account as a debt.
- If the Scholar fails to spend the agreed scholar money, this cannot carry over to the next academic year. All receipts and payments must be made and submitted within the academic year. A year will be defined as 12 months from the first teaching week in semester 1 for September starters, and the first teaching week in Semester 2 for January starters. As published in the academic calendar.
- A Scholar transferring from ARU to another university before the scheduled finish of their degree will be liable to repay any financial contributions made to them in the current academic year, through the sports scholarship programme (see General Terms and Conditions).

Training, Matches, and Competitions

- Scholars are expected to have 100% attendance at training, matches, strength and conditioning sessions, and any other event organised by the HPSC, unless athletes have;
 - International, or representative (national team) competitions
 - · University exams
 - Injury / illness (evidence from sport therapists or doctor's note will be required)
 - · Other reasons agreed in advance with the HPSC
- Scholars unable to attend training or matches for any reasons should communicate this to the Head Coach or HPSC prior to the event.
- Scholars competing in sports that require individual entry into BUCS competitions should ensure that they have provided ARU staff with all of the required information for this purpose.
- When representing the University (competitions and presentations)
 Scholars must wear either ARU kit or Sport Scholar kit. At non-university competitions athletes should wear Sport Scholar kit where possible to help represent and promote ARU.
- ARU has a number of partner clubs and when the Scholar's sport is catered for it is expected that Scholars will compete for the partner club as well as competing for ARU in BUCS competitions, unless agreed with the HPSC in advance.
- If the Scholars can no longer compete in their sport, or performance / results have decreased over an extended period of time (to be reviewed each term) resulting in the Scholar no longer being one of the top athletes at ARU the scholarship may be withdrawn.

Academic

- Scholars are expected to abide by the Student Charter and Academic Regulations at all time.
- Scholars must comply with BUCS REG 6 Individual eligibility and team selection when competing in BUCS sports (full <u>BUCS regulations</u>)
- ARU have a policy that allows students to participate in sporting fixtures without sacrificing their academic attendance. The Wednesday Afternoon Policy should be followed when there is a clash between lectures and sporting fixtures.
- If a Scholar has a major competition which can include, but is not limited to, European, World, Commonwealth, and Olympic Games the Scholar needs to inform the HPSC in a timely fashion. The HPSC will work with the University academic department to try and support academic flexibility to support attendance at the competition.
- Students on a Tier 4 visa will become ineligible for sport if they fail to comply with ARU's tier 4 attendance monitoring policy.

Injury

- Scholars who are unfortunate to suffer from injury are expected to engage with the University's sport therapists at the earliest opportunity to get a recovery strategy in place.
- Scholars are expected to follow the advice of ARU sports therapists during recovery, and training should be supervised by the Strength and Conditioning Coach (S + C coach) in conjunction with the ARU Sport Therapists.
- The Scholar is responsible for keeping all relevant parties (Head Coaches, HPSC, S + C coach) informed on their progress.

Private Sponsorship

- Scholars are allowed to engage in private sponsorship but this must be separate from ARU, and private sponsorship branding cannot be on any ARU clothing.
- If it is deemed that any private sponsor could be damaging to the University's reputation or not in line with the values of ARU then the University has the right to request termination of this sponsorship or to withdraw support from the Scholar.
- Any promotional material the athlete wishes to use that promotes themselves, and has ARU branding involved, needs to be approved by ARU before it can be publicised.

Social Media

- Scholars are actively encouraged to engage in social media, however this should be appropriate of all times and in line with the <u>ARU Social</u> Media Policy
- All scholars are expected to attend social media training at the start of their time at ARU so they can positively promote themselves and ARU.

Communication

- Scholars are expected to provide, and keep updated, contact details
 to ARU and this will be used as the primary means of communication.
 Scholars must reply to all correspondence within 48 hrs during term
 time, and 1 week during vacation periods. If a Scholar knows this will
 not be possible they need to inform the HPSC before being away.
- If at any stage a scholar wishes to withdraw from their academic
 programme, ceases to participate in their sport, or for any other reason
 wishes to resign from the Scholarship programme they must meet
 with the HPSC. If they still wish to withdraw following the meeting then
 they must do so in writing to the HPSC.

Anti-doping Policies and Procedures

- Scholars are expected to comply with the UK Anti-Doping policies and procedures at all time. Scholars committing any anti-doping violation will have their scholarships withdrawn
- ARU has a zero tolerance policy regarding the use of recreational drugs.

General

Scholars are expected to comply with the <u>Rules, Regulations, and</u>
 <u>Procedures</u> for students policy at all times.
