AFMC MBBS 2010

1. Applications are invited for AFMC Admission 2010 to the MBBS course at Armed Forces Medical College (AFMC), Pune, commencing from **02 Aug 2010.** Total 130 candidates (including a maximum of 25 girls) will be selected.

AFMC 2010 Exam Date: 02 May, 2010

All the 105 boys and 25 girls admitted to Armed Forces Medical College, Pune have compulsory liability to serve as commissioned officers in the Armed Forces Medical Services on graduation.

The type of commission will depend upon the vacancies available and merit-cum-option at the final MBBS Examination.

The liability of the Short Service Commission (SSC) officers passing out of AFMC to serve the Armed Forces Medical Services would be seven (7) years. All candidates admitted to the college are required to execute a bond to this effect for an amount of Rs.

- 15 lacs (Rupees Fifteen lacs) at the time of joining the college. Students removed from service liability due to any reason will have to pay the bond money as per conditions laid down by Govt of India.
- 2. Ten seats are reserved for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe candidates who also have similar service liability and have to fulfil the requirements of medical fitness, age, educational qualification and qualifying the entrance examination as per details given in the prospectus.
- **3. AFMC 2010 SPECIAL CONCESSIONS:** The Govt will provide free accommodation and entitled rations, subsidised messing, AC 3 Tier free railway warrant from college to home and back during vacations, a book subsidy of Rs. 12,000/- during entire training period, uniform allowance of Rs. 6000/- per student during first year and Rs. 1250/- per year as maintenance allowance in subsequent years and any other misc allowances as applicable.
- 4. All candidates should be medically fit as per laid down standards for the Armed Forces.
- 5. Only unmarried candidates are eligible. Marriage during the course is not permitted. AFMC college is fully and compulsorily residential both for boys and girls.

AFMC 2010 Scheme of Examination:

The competitive written examination will be of 2 hours duration and will have one paper comprising of 200 objective type questions in the following subjects.

Subject	Total Questions
Biology (Zoology and Botany)	50
Chemistry	50
Physics	50
Intelligence, Logic and Reasoning	25
English Language and Comprehension	25

Each question would be of one mark and for each correct answer one mark will be credited. Wrong answers will have negative marks. For each wrong answer 0.25 marks will be deducted. Use of calculator, cellphone. PDA and log tables are not permitted in the examination.

6. AFMC Entrance 2010 Educational Qualification: Applicants must have passed the XII standard/pre-professional/premedical examination or equivalent examination of statutory Indian University/Board or any other recognized Board/University as a regular student in all the subjects opted for in FIRST ATTEMPT with the subjects of English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology securing not less than 60% of aggregate marks in the three science subjects taken together, not less than 50% marks in each of the science subjects and not less than 50% marks in English.

They must have also passed an examination in Mathematics at least of the matriculation standard.

A graduate of B.Sc. Examination with not less than two of the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Biology (Botany or Zoology) and also must have passed the earlier qualifying examination i.e. XII standard/Pre professional (Med) with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English and obtained marks as stated above.

Note:

- (a) Candidates who are to appear in the qualifying examination (10+2 or equivalent) upto 01 May 2010 may also appear for the test provisionally.
- (b) The following categories of students are NOT ELIGIBLE to apply:
 - i. Candidates who have passed in Domestic Science, Domestic Arithmetic, Lower Maths separately or in combination with other subjects like General Science, Social studies in High School/Higher Secondary (Multi Purpose) or equivalent examination
 - ii. Candidates who have passed only Pre-University/Pre-Degree (one year course) or Pre-Professional in Agriculture/Veterinary/Dental Examination
- iii. Candidates who have passed the Pre-Professional or equivalent qualifying examination as private candidates.
- **7. AFMC Exam 2010 Age Limit:** Must have attained the age of 17 years on 31 December 2010 but must NOT have attained the age of 22 years on the date i.e. not born earlier than 01 January 1989 and not later than 31 December 1993, if the academic qualification of the candidate is 10+2 or equivalent. A candidate who has passed B.Sc. examination or will be appearing in final B.Sc. examination and seeks admission, he/she must not have attained the age of 24 years on 31 December 2010 i.e. must have been born not earlier than 01 January 1987.

- 1. To be declared fit for AFMC Admission, the candidate must be in good physical and mental health and free from any disability likely to interfere with the efficient performance of duty in the Armed Forces.
- 2. AFMC Medical Examination will be carried out by a Board of Officers at AFMC Pune, prior to admission to the College. Medical Board will categorise the candidates as Fit and Unfit, in accordance with the prescribed standards.

Candidates declared UNFIT are entitled to appeal on payment of a fee of Rs. 40/-. The procedure will be intimated to the concerned candidates by the President of the Medical Board.

3. Medical fitness for admission to MBBS Courses at AFMC will be decided by the Medical Board as per para 2 above.

However, the following few important physical requirements are being indicated for guidance of the candidates. The candidates in their own interest may get themselves medically examined to avoid any disappointment later on :-

- a. They should be free from serious deformity and mal-developments. There should be no scoliosis, spina bifida and other skeletal deformities apparent or on clinical examination.
- b. There should be no impediment of speech.
- c. There should be no sign of functional/organic disease of the heart and blood
- d. There should be no evidence of pulmonary tuberculosis or previous history of this disease or any other chronic disease of the lungs. NOTE-X-rav of chest will be taken for this purpose.
- e. There should be no evidence of any disease of the digestive system, including any abnormality of the liver and spleen.
- f. There should be no inguinal hernia or tendency thereto, hydrocoele or definite varicocoele or any other disease or defect of the genital organs. Candidates who have been operated for hernia may be declared medically fit provided:
 - i. One year has elapsed since operation. Documentary proof to this effect is to be provided by the candidates.
 - ii. General tone of the abdominal musculature is good.
 - iii. There has been no recurrence of the hernia or any complication concerned with the operation.
- g. There is no fistula or evidence of piles.
- h. There is no disease of the kidneys, including glycosuria or albuminuria.
- i. There is no disease of the skin.
- j. There is no active, latent or congenital STD.
- k. There is no history of epilepsy and any mental and psychiatric disorder.
- 1. There is no squint or any other morbid condition of the eye and eyelids.
- m. There is no active trachoma or its complications.
- n. There are no enlarged glands (Lymph nodes) in the neck and other parts of the

body.

- o. The height and weight requirements will depend upon the age, body build and racial characteristics as per standards laid down for Armed Forces.
 - i. **Girts Standard:** In case of female candidates, minimum height of 144 cms and minimum weight of 36 Kgs is essential.
 - ii. **Boys Standards:** The male candidates with height below 157.5 cms (152.5 cms for Gorkhas, Nepalese, Assamese and Garhwali) and weight below 47 Kgs will not be accepted irrespective of age and other factors.
 - iii. Overweight and obese candidates as per Height/Age/Weight standards for the Armed Forces will be declared unfit.
- p. There should be a minimum 5 cms range of chest expansion.
- q. Minimum of 14 dental points are essential and candidates should be free from severe pyorrhoea and advanced caries.
- r. There should be no ear discharge and no perforation of the eardrum/nasal septum. There should also be no hard wax in the ear canal, obstructing the view of the ear drum.
- s. Visual Standards:

Minimum color vision standard should be CP-3 (Defective Safe).

Notes:

- 1. Fundus and Media to be healthy and within normal limits.
- 2. No undue degenerative signs of vitreous or chorio-retinitis to be present, suggesting progressive myopia.
- 3. Minimum colour vision standard should be CP-3 (Defective Safe).
- 4. Should have good binocular vision, fusion faculty and full field of vision in both eyes.
- 5. There should be no organic disease likely to exacerbate or deteriorate.
- 6. Candidates who have undergone Lasik surgery will be governed as per provisions of Office of DGAFMS/Departmental instructions issued from time to time. Lasik/PRK for correction of vision are permitted only for candidates of age

- 20 years and above and even among them a period of 06 months should have elapsed after the procedure.
- t. **Hearing Standard:** Hearing will be tested by speech test, if required audiomciric records will also be taken.
- i. **Speech Test**: The candidate should be able to hear a forced whisper with each ear separately, standing with his/her back to the examiner at a distance of 20 feet in a reasonably quiet room. The examiner should whisper with the residual air, that is to say, at the end of an ordinary expiration.
- ii. **Audiometric record:** The candidates should have no loss of hearing in either ear at frequencies of 128 to 4.096 cycles per second (Audiometry reading between plus 10 and minus 10),
- 4. The Medical Board will be guided by departmental instructions issued from time to time. The above guidelines are for the information of candidates only.

AFMC Exam 2010 Exam Centres

- (a) A list of cities alongwith their code numbers both numeric and alphabetic where the examination will be conducted is given.
- (b) The candidates shall fill up the code (both numeric and alphabetic) of the city from where he/she wishes to appear for the written examination in the application form.
- (c) The candidates shall give three different choices of cities in order of preference from where he/she wishes to appear for the written examination. All three choices have to be filled and no choices will be repeated. No change in centre choices is permitted after the submission of the application form and no correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
- (d) One of the three choices will be accepted provided vacancy exists. Otherwise, the admission cell will allot a centre depending upon the availability of vacancy.
- (e) If the candidate does not fill in three different choices, the application will be summarily rejected.
- (f) Written Examination Centre allotted by the college will be final and no request for change, under any circumstances will be entertained.

- Candidates who are found provisionally eligible as per the criteria of eligibility, will be called at one of the examination centres to appear in the competitive examination on 1st Sunday of May. Issue of admit cards. however does not necessarily mean acceptance of eligibility which will be further scrutinized at subsequent stages of selection.
- The written examination centre will be allotted to candidates depending upon the administrative arrangements for the examination and availability of adequate seating capacity

• The Roll Number of the candidates who qualify for interview based on the above written examination will be published in the leading newspapers

The college/DGAFMS take no responsibility for any error or omission in the roll numbers published in the newspapers.

AFMC Interview of Candidate:

- On the basis of their performance in the written examination selected candidates in order of roll numbers will be called for an interview to be held in the month of June at AFMC, PUNE.
- The exact date of the above interview will be intimidated to the selected candidates. Request for change of date of interview will NOT be entertained. The candidates will be required to produce originals of all certificates/mark sheets at the time of interview. All candidates will produce result or proof of having appeared in the qualifying examination held, at the time of interview (if the result of such examination has not been declared).
- On the basis of the above test and interview two merit lists, one for boys and one for girls, will be drawn up and admissions will be offered only to candidates in accordance with their merit position. Individual letters of admission will be sent only to selected candidates who would be required to join AFMC. The remaining candidates will be on waiting list. The result will be published by the DGAFMS in the newspapers.

SC/ST Candidates:

Ten seats are reserved for SC/ST candidates provided: The SC/ST candidates must qualify in the written examination and come within the zone to be called up for interview. They must come within the first 500 in the final combined merit list of boys and girls.

AFMC 2010 Syllabus: The general standard of the entrance examination will be that of 11th and 12th class under the 10+2 scheme/pre-medical/intermediate science or an equivalent examination of the State Education Board/Indian University
