

## **ISAT TEST TAKING TIPS**

IIST (Indian Institute of Space Science and Technology) offers undergraduate, post graduate and doctoral programmes focused on space science and technology. Candidates who wish to get admission in undergraduate courses at IIST will have to appear in All India Admission Test (ISAT 2011). The admission test is scheduled for 16th April 2011!

### **ISAT 2011**

ISAT 2011 exam paper will have three separate sections on Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. All these sections will consist of objective type questions. The exam will be conducted across various centers in the country. The entrance examination is scheduled for 16th April 2011. Candidates taking the exam should be well read with their science subjects. Clarity of concepts is a must to clear the exam.

Results for ISAT 2011 will be declared in May. Candidates can check their results on the official website. The candidates cannot request for regarding/re-totaling after ISAT results 2011 are declared as there is no provision for it. Also, the answered Optical Response Sheets are not made available to the students.

### **Prep Tips for ISAT 2011**

For the upcoming ISAT 2011 exam candidates should keep in mind some important preparation tips.

To perform well in the IIST's ISAT 2011, students need to put in a lot of work hard over a period of time. Even though the competition is less, the exam paper is quite tough. The competition for IIST 2011 admission test is primarily due to the less number of students being inclined towards the Space Science studies.

Candidates should have strong knowledge of the concepts in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. Clarity of concepts and the ability to apply this conceptual knowledge is an essential trait being looked for.

Practicing with IIST sample papers is important to know the pattern of the paper. Take timed tests to calculate your problem solving ability.

It is crucial that students perform well in all the sections to qualify the ISAT 2011 exam. This is because, separate cut-offs are calculated for different sections - Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. Based on the performance in all the three subjects, rank list is prepared. Admission to the program is based on merit list that is prepared once the results for the entrance exam is announced. Even though the competition to the Space Technology program is limited, it is important to study hard and get good marks to make it to the Indian Institute of Space Science and Technology.
