

### PART - B

Unfortunately, in many parts of the world, man has not realised that the third of these services is the most important. In this eagerness to draw in large numbers only to find that with them he has lost the best friends he had. Even where a government realises the importance of a plentiful supply of trees, it is difficult for it to persuade the villagers to see this. The villagers want wood to cook their food with; and can earn money by making charcoal or selling wood to the townsmen. They are usually too lazy or careless to plant and look after new trees. So, unless the government has a good system of control, or can educate the people, the forests will slowly disappear. This does not mean the villager's sons and grandsons have fewer trees. The results are even more serious: for where there are trees their roots break the soil allowing the rain to sink in and also bind the soil thus preventing its being washed away easily; but where there are no trees the rain falls on hard ground and carries away the rich top-soil. Nothing remains but worthless desert.
