

OVERVIEW

The Master of Architecture (M.Arch) degree offered through the School of Architecture & Construction Management at Washington State University Spokane is accredited by the National Architecture Accrediting Board (NAAB). Once completed, this degree allows students to participate in an architect internship program and qualify for the state architecture licensing exam.

M.Arch students engage in course work in site design, structures, technology, and history and theory. The culmination of graduate study is a two-semester graduate studio project. It is expected that the project be based on a defined hypothesis and demonstrate a comprehensive understanding and solution to a particular issue in architecture.

INTERDISCIPLINARITY

Students studying on the Spokane campus have the opportunity to engage with students in participating programs such as Interior Design and Landscape Architecture. This interaction reinforces individual disciplinary knowledge and skills, while developing additional interdisciplinary depth of understanding in areas such as People and Place, History, Theory and Criticism, and Digital Design. These unique learning experiences provide the added value that positions students competitively in a dynamic marketplace.

AREAS OF DESIGN

Working in the realm of physical design, students in the M.Arch program study the field of architecture in the context of interdisciplinary thinking. The general areas of architectural emphasis include histories and theories of architectural design; building technologies; programmatic use; representation; and site design (urban and rural contexts). Projects address a range of design issues, some that are highly theoretical and others that focus on material-technological issues.

COURSES OF STUDY

There are three different tracks for completing the M.Arch degree at Washington State University.

- Track 1 is a 1 ½ year program (3 semesters plus summer) for students with a four-year Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies from WSU or a professional accredited degree (B.Arch) from a university in the US.
- Track 2 is a 2 ½ year program (5 semesters plus summer) for students who have a four-year undergraduate pre-professional degree in architecture from a US university or its equivalent. Track 2 includes completion of one year of additional architecture classes in preparation for the 1 ½ year sequence.
- Track 3 is a 3 ½ year (7 semesters plus summer) program for students who have an undergraduate degree in a non architectural field.
- Determination for admission for all tracks is based upon accomplishments and skills in course work and design as demonstrated through the student portfolio (if applicable).

Required coursework for Track 2 and 3 is individually determined by an admissions committee based on applicant's previous academic history, and may include coursework on the Pullman campus when necessary.

Note: Curriculum does not show Track 2 or 3 required undergraduate coursework as it is individually determined by an Admissions Committee based on applicant's previous degrees and relevant coursework.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Selection of Master of Architecture students is highly competitive and is made during the spring semester with initial coursework beginning the following fall semester.

All applicants must submit application materials by: January 10.

Notification of acceptance will be on or before March 1.

Required application materials include:

- Official Graduate School application and fee of \$50 (paid by Visa or MasterCard).
 Complete the application at: http://www.gradsch.wsu.edu/howtoapply.htm.
- Official transcripts from all colleges previously attended; a 3.0 minimum GPA in the last 60 graded semester hours or 90 graded quarter hours is required (WSU architecture students need not submit transcripts);
- Minimum TOEFL score of 550 paper-based or 213 computer based test (international applicants);
- Master of Architecture program application;
- Statement of program intentions;
- Portfolio of work in design and/or other visual arts;
 - The portfolio should provide the Master of Architecture review committee with an overall understanding of applicant's skills in the areas of design, drawing and representation, model making, and freehand drawing and diagramming. Other areas that may be included as appropriate are painting, sculpture, watercolor, and creative writing.

- o All material must be submitted in an 8 ½ x 11" format in a three ring binder. Number of pages not to exceed 10 (double sided). Images should be placed in plastic inserts. A brief narrative should be used to explain and identify each work, and the context in which it was generated (course work, independent travel, etc.). If professional work is submitted, identify your role and specific involvement in the project. All work must show highest ability and skill. Portfolio should be clear, well organized and easily read. Include addressed envelope, with postage, if you want your portfolio returned. Graphic design of pages (layout, images, text) should be carefully considered.
- Do not submit slides and CD's, loose sheets, rolled drawings, original works, or lengthy reports or papers. Also, do not include the statement of intent, application, or other documents inside the portfolio. These should be submitted separately.
- Names and contact information for three references. Your references will automatically be contacted through the application system and asked to submit electronically a recommendation form. Since their recommendations will come directly to the Graduate School once they have submitted the electronic version, there is no need for a paper recommendation. Please contact these references to be sure they are willing to respond to your request for a recommendation and ask them to discuss your leadership, academic standards, and skills as they pertain to your primary interest area.
- And all other requirements of the WSU Graduate School as stated on the application form.
