

Shortlisting Criteria for PGP 2012-14 Batch

70% weightage is given to the CAT/GMAT score and 30% weightage is given to the Application Rating Score.

Application Rating (AR): 2012-14

- Percentages for incomplete Bachelor's Degree Applicants are based on their available marks.
- Only those with completed Master's Degree is considered. For those with more than one completed Master's Degree the highest percentage of marks obtained is to be used.
- For those candidates having cleared CA/ICWAI without having Bachelor's Degree, their average of inter and final levels marks will be treated as Bachelor's degree marks.

- Application Rating Score: (AxBxC)+D+E** **Maximum Score for AR = 33**

It was decided that approximately three candidates per seat across all categories be called for Personal Interview. Based on the above criteria, the following candidates have been shortlisted for Personal Interview:

- 01 Top 561 General Category candidates. The minimum composite score in this category is 0.7050
- 02 Top 314 NC-OBC Category candidates. The minimum composite score in this category is 0.5950
- 03 Top 177 SC Category candidates. The minimum composite score in this category is 0.5210
- 04 Top 87 ST Category candidates. The minimum composite score in this category is 0.4530
- 05 Top 38 DA Category Candidates. The minimum composite score in this category is 0.4620

Calculation of composite score is as follows

$$\begin{array}{r} \text{Obtained CAT score} \\ \hline 450 \end{array} \times 0.7 \quad + \quad \begin{array}{r} \text{Obtained Academic Rating} \\ \hline 33 \end{array} \times 0.3$$

As for the overseas candidates, the following equivalent CAT scores for the GMAT scores were applied:

The composite score was calculated based on the equivalent CAT score and Application Rating as above.

* CAT refers to CAT-2011

* GMAT refers to GMAT administered within the last 24 months as on 15 December 2011
