It is physically impossible for a well-educated intellectual to make money the chief object of his thoughts, just as it is for him to make his dinner the principal object of them. All healthy people like their dinners, but their dinner is not the main object of their lives.

So all, healthy minded people like making money ought to like it and enjoy the sensation of winning it, it is something better than money. A good soldier, for instance, mainly wishes to do his fighting well.
