- 1. Annotate any **four** of the following passages with reference to the context in not more than 150 words each: $4\times5=20$
 - (i) '....if I had an appointment with a Godin....Godet....Godot....anyhow, you see who I mean, I'd wait till its was a black night before I gave up'
 - (ii) You see this creature with her kerbstone English: the English that will keep her in the gutter to the end of her days. Well, sir, in three months I could pass that girl off as a duchess at an ambassador's garden party.



(iii) You know that I am an indulgent master;

And therefore conceal nothing.

What's your medicine,

To draw so many several sorts of wild fowl?

- (iv) List, list, O list!
 - If thou didst ever thy dear father love....
 - Revenge his foul and most unnatural murder....
- (v) I rage and shout my head off, and everyone thinks "poor chap!" or "what an objectionable young man!" But that girl there can twist your arm off with her silence... I want to be there when you grovel. I want to be there, I want to watch it, I want the front seat.
- 2. Write a long note on: Changes in the conventions of Revenge Drama in Elizabethan England. (400 words) 20

Where knowledge should be strength, it turns out to be a weakness in *Doctor Faustus*. Discuss. (400 words)

3. Analyse Hamlet's response to his mother's marriage to Claudius. (400 words)

OR

In A Midsummer Night's Dream Athens has 'a hierarchical patriarchal order' while the forest seems to be 'a place of disorder'. Discuss. (400 words)



4.	Jonson's play is a satire on the profession of alchemy; but
	alchemy is also of metaphorical significance in his play.
	Comment. (400 words)

Discuss theatricality as a metaphor in any of the plays in your course (e.g. in *Hamlet*, etc.). (400 words)

5. Would you agree that the real themes of *The Playboy of the Western World* are love and marriage, and not patricide? Justify your answer. (400 words)

How does Look Back in Anger reflect the changing equations between the sexes in post-war Britain? (400 words)

6. The martyrdom of Thomas Becket in Eliot's Murder in the Cathedral is best understood as a conflict between the individual and the state. Discuss. (400 words)

In Waiting for Godot Beckett is not speaking of any particular place, but of a 'cosmic state, a world condition in which all humanity is involved'. Discuss. (400 words)

 - (i) Chorus of women in Murder in the Cathedral
 - (ii) The serpent in Helena's dream
 - (iii) Dark comedy
 - (iv) Claudius in the prayer scene in Hamlet
