- 3. a) Critically examine the efficacy of law in controlling crimes against women.

- b) Explain the legal response to sexual exploitation of children and abuse of adoption process.
- 4. a) Examine the social transformation brought through agrarian reforms. How has law humanised industrialisation of agriculture?

- b) Discuss the thoughts and deeds of Gandhiji and Vinoba Bhave through approaches, alternative to law.
