- e) What is meant by 'Field of Experience' and 'Communication Competence' as elements of communication process?
- f) Business and professional communication includes, among others, two communication skill categories: Relational Life and Work Life. What skill / competencies are required to master communication under each of these categories?
- g) What do you understand by 'Communication Climate' in an organization? Discuss 'Open versus Closed' communication.
