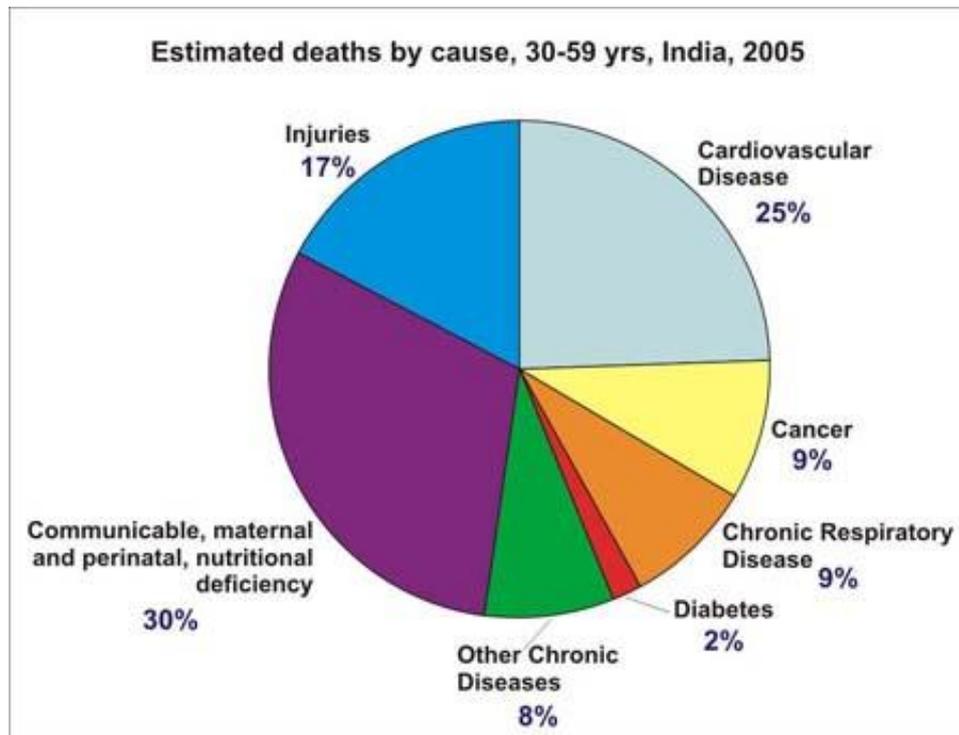

Third Cinema is committed to political and cultural liberation. The term should not be confused with 'Third World Cinema' (a category in its own right), although for historical reasons Third Cinema first emerged in Latin America in the decade after the 1959 Cuban revolution, which greatly influenced it. The term implies two other cinemas. First Cinema operates primarily as a commodity, and is dominant culturally and industrially. It is not homogenous, but from Hollywood to low-budget generic production in Nigeria, it has a certain unity in its characteristics, commercial intentions and mode of address.

Historically, Second Cinema emerged as an alternative to First Cinema, emphasizing the importance of national cultural expression from a middle-class perspective. Essentially an art cinema, it is committed to the notion of the director's unique artistic vision and sensibility.

Like First Cinema, Third Cinema seeks to address a popular audience, but as political subjects who are part of historical processes, rather than consumers. Like Second Cinema, Third Cinema places great emphasis on cultural expression and identity. Eschewing the élitism and individualism of Second Cinema, it focuses instead on the hunger for cultural expression of politically marginalized classes and groups. Third Cinema can work with different forms of documentary, and across the range of fictional genres. *The Emerald Forest* (USA, 1988), *Mapantsula* (South Africa, 1988) and *Earth* (India, 1999) are examples of Third Cinema.

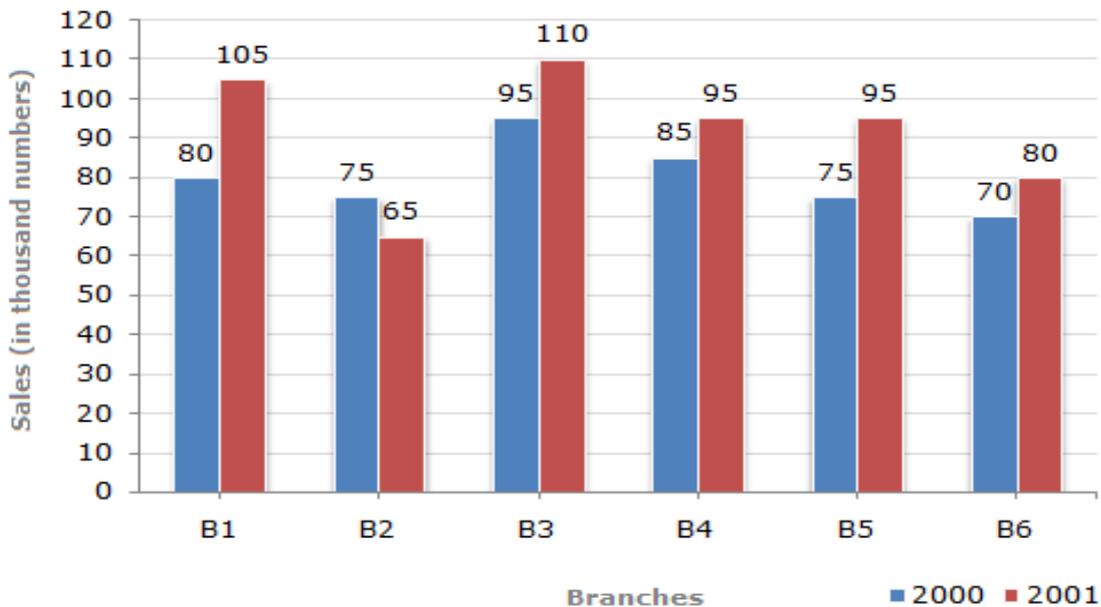
