As a result of disintegration of joint families, the aged have lost the traditional source of economic and social support which was easily available to them in joint families.

are sexually harassed sometimes by their fellow students, or teachers, or by strangers as they walk down to school. These pressures are central to low enrolment and retention of girls. Poverty also plays its part. If their clothes are torn, girls from poor families will stay at home. In such cases they are forced by the demand of modesty and propriety.
