# From the Chairman's Desk

This note is written Off the Desk while I am travelling in USA. Each visit of mine to other Countries remind me our inability to catch up in the race in respect of living conditions, the systems and their maintenance, engineering and technology included. We in India are happy that we are able to achieve a growth rate of 7 to 9% and world talking about India's progress as a fast developing and formidable country after China. This may be true as far as physical and economic growth is concerned. But looking from a different angle I feel we must accept that we are failing, to say the least, even to adopt the good practices followed in advanced countries in respect of quality of life and living standards. This is not a pessimistic view but a reality.

For example, the recent severe snow storm in the Midwest USA is catastrophical and shattered the normal life. Yet the situation is brought back to normalcy by prompt actions and systems in place. The Government's actions and people's response is equally appreciable. Even after 24" of snowfall in one day, people are back to their normal work within 24 hours. The enormous efforts to clear the roads, to move the immobilised vehicles, putting back the public transport system with ease are something amazing. In contrast, even a 5cm rain in Hyderabad creates a huge dislocation to normal life, not once but every time.

I have seen a road accident happen just a few yards ahead. The traffic is stopped for a couple of minutes, the police, ambulances and relief teams arrived exactly in five minutes as we are watching. The first thing the teams did was to make the inmates comfortable, check their physical and psychological conditions, give first aid and move them into the ambulance. Both the cars are lifted from the carriageway and road cleared. All this operation took exactly 17 minutes and in the meanwhile cops were in position to divert the traffic. I was unable to comprehend this to happen back in our country, though it is not difficult to happen.

Many of such contrasts are seen by many of us who travelled to other developed countries, and should we not think why so? The basic issues to be addressed are:

1. Identification of problem precisely and anatomically. 2. Search for alternate options for solution. 3. Selection of Optimal solution and correct decision. 4. Plan for implementation meticulously and in detail. 5. Resource mobilisation. 6. Implementation of planned actions. 7. Monitoring and Review. 8. Technical and Social auditing.

All this needs sincerety of purpose by the Government, its political and executive wings, on one hand and respect for rule of law, responsive and responsible attitude of people on the other hand. The situation can change and things can happen in our country also with good citizenship, empathy for suffering groups, respect for fellow countrymen which is seen here very distinctly. People come forward here to discharge their responsibilities in addition to the Government's efforts. It is just enough if people do not create obstructions in the way of Government's actions if they are for common good. To achieve this the mindset has to change in politicians and people's attitudes need reorientation. At decision making stage, both legislative and executive, priorities and non priorities need to be discriminated. Technical and professional opinion shall be respected and people's participation encouraged to ensure transparency in public spending. Many of ills emanate from the absence of mutual trust and this can be addressed if we realise that morals and ethics are important not only in personal life but also in public life. Let us look forward to a bright future in this direction in our country along with growth and development.

# Popular Lecture on "CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES IN AERONAUTICS"

**February 1, 2010:** Shri B S Sastry, Project Director (Retd.), Secondary Power System (Hydraulic & Electric Power System) Light Combat Aircraft, Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India delivering a Popular Lecture on "**Challenges and Opportunities in Aeronautics**" said that in the aviation industry, there are some interesting developments taking place. The design and simulation tools for predicting the performance of systems and components are changing with user friendly packages and drastic reduction in cost. Most of the design, analysis and simulation tools are available on Windows NT or LINUX operating systems with reasonable cost. The computer cluster concept is enabling the processing power of super computers within the easy reach of many designers. The design chain accelerator will enable faster designs with drastic reduction in time. The digital mock-up and virtual reality software is enabling to workout MRO schedules at the design-stage itself. The virtual machining software is helping to streamline manufacturing processes and tooling details to prepare process sheets for manufacture as well as to formulate the quality standards. With the above mentioned softwares it is possible to achieve SIX-SIGMA standards. The materials (Vacuum are melted steels and electro slag refined steels) cost of super alloys, titanium based alloys and composites are coming down. Recently the Chinese & Swiss have brought out a two seater electric plane with lithium ion batteries. Many Universities in US are experimenting with 'Flying Cars'. It is predicted that flying cars will go into production in the year 2011/2012.
