With the mushrooming of new engineering and management institutes in the region, most of the new faculty members try to bargain when they face any challenge. This issue not only puts the pressure of teaching load on other faculty members but also dilutes the quality of education. • Financial problems of students for admission: There is another challenge before University in the area of financial planning. As most of the students belong to rural areas and come from financially weak background so University has to depend on the government (Social Welfare Dept.) for fee realization. Government takes due course of time to receive the applications, verify them & release the payments that makes the financial planning of university under pressure. If the delay is more than a year, it also impacts the investments to be made in the infrastructure, labs, building etc. and thereby the number of admissions the University can take. • Electricity availability. Being in rural area the availability of
		electricity is a major problem with the University.


