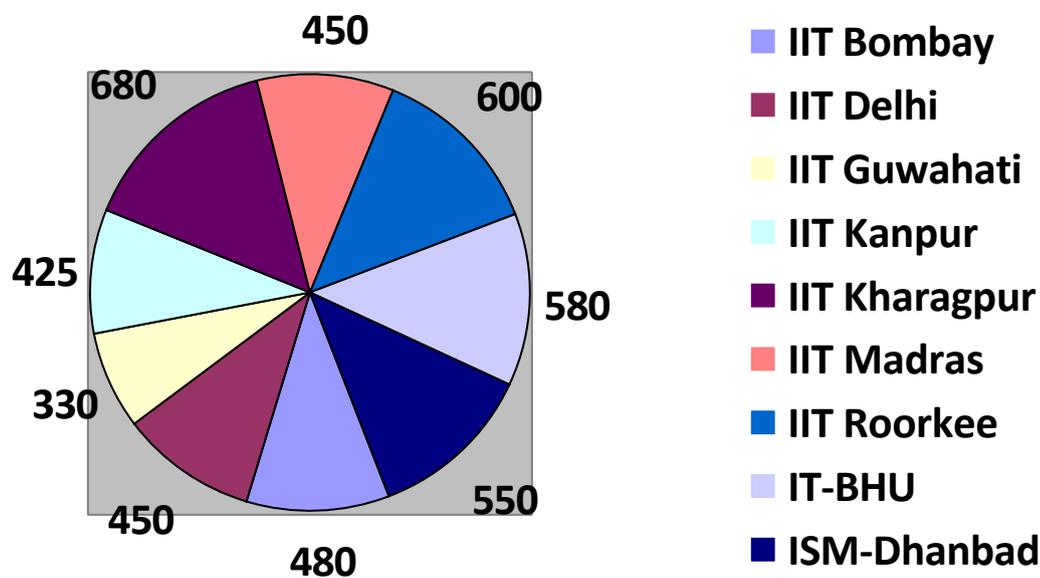


Too many students and too little seats in top colleges - it's the bane of Indian education right from nursery to graduation and beyond. Number of applicants for engineering has been increasing exponentially over the past few years; seats available for the general category are not. Here is mentioned a ready reckoner of seats available in Engineering colleges all over India. Below we have analyzed seats offered to aspiring candidates in various branches by Top 100 engineering institutes of India. The numbers of seats available is classified based on nature of candidature of applicant i.e. state level or national level. The following data indicates the number of seats available for **general category** only.

Firstly, let's have a look towards the seats availability at the dream institute of every engineering aspirant, IITs. For general category 7 IITs, BHU-Varanasi, and ISM-Dhanbad, in all offer around 4520 seats. They are distributed between these institutes as follows.



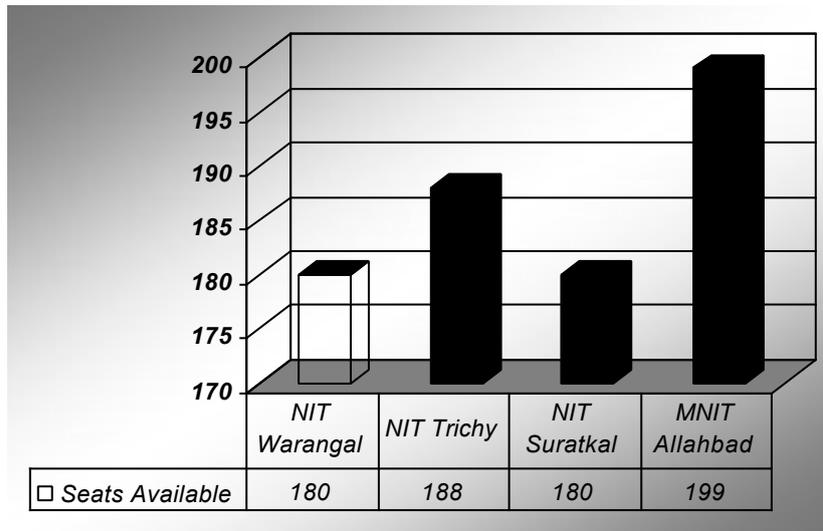
The admissions in these IITs are made purely on the basis of National Rank in IIT-JEE, a joint entrance exam held by IITs. The particular state candidature is of no relevance.

Government Institutions have always occupied high reputation in higher education. NITs, National Institute of Technology, are spread all over India providing engineering education in various fields. These institutes offer very limited number of seats and emphasize both on state level and national level candidature, with seats being divided equally between the two. For both national & State level, admissions are based on Rank scored in AIEEE (All India Engineering Entrance Examination). In all, there are 20 NITs, and another 10 have been started in 2010 with limited seats that could approximately amount to 3045 seats for general category for All India level.

Although NITs offer a very high quality of education, level of education and their reputation vary highly between them. NITs can be broadly divided into 3 categories:

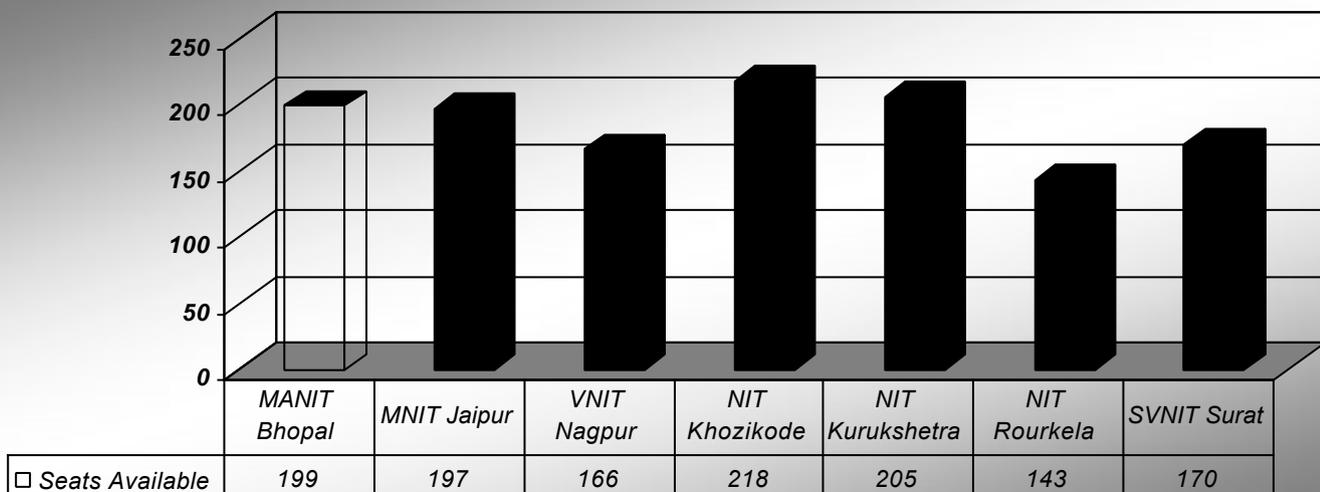
A category:

This includes NIT Warangal, NIT Trichy, NIT Surathkal and MNIT Allahabad which account for a total of 747 seats for the general category.



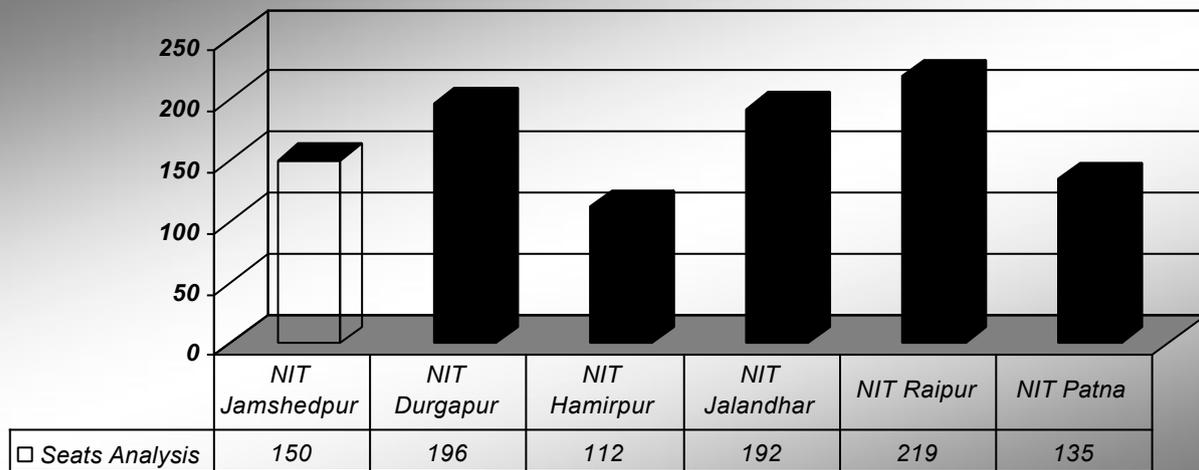
#### B Category:

This category includes MANIT Bhopal, MNIT Jaipur, VNIT Nagpur, NIT Kozhikode, NIT Kurukshetra, NIT Rourkela and SVNIT Surat. A total of 1298 seats are available for All India general category in these institutes.



#### C Category:

Here, the Home State cut offs are not so high and students from respective states have good chances of admissions if they do above reasonably good in the AIEEE test. Institutes in this category include NIT Jamshedpur, NIT Durgapur, NIT Jalandhar, NIT Hamirpur, NIT Patna, NIT Silchar, NIT Srinagar, NIT Tripura. Seats for general category are distributed as follows:



Other top ranked government institutions include Punjab Engineering College (PEC University), DTU Formerly Delhi College of Engineering (DCE), Netaji Subhash Institute of technology (NSIT). These institutes offer around 300 seats collectively for All India general category selections.

There are also some renowned self Financed Deemed Universities which conduct All India Level Entrance exams separately all over India. Aspirants can appear in the exams if they meet the eligibility criteria like minimum percentage in 10+2 examinations, Age, number of attempts etc. The list of some self financed deemed universities which come under top 100 engineering colleges of India includes BITS, Pilani Thapar University (50% of the total seats are for All India level candidates), Patiala Manipal Institute of Technology

These universities contribute about approximate 20,000 more seats to the tally. The breakup of seats is as follows:

Moving over to state level colleges in top 100, Andhra Pradesh has around 14 colleges (excluding NIT). In these colleges, majority numbers of seats are reserved for AP State Candidates only. Though students in AP are considered to be very competitive, in IITs also AP is the state from where maximum number of students gets admissions in different IITs.

Tamil Nadu has around 11 colleges that fall in Top 100 Colleges. Out of these 11, 6 are government and private Trust Institutions where the seats are reserved for Tamil Nadu candidates. The remaining 5 are Self Financed Deemed Universities where the admissions are open to National level students.

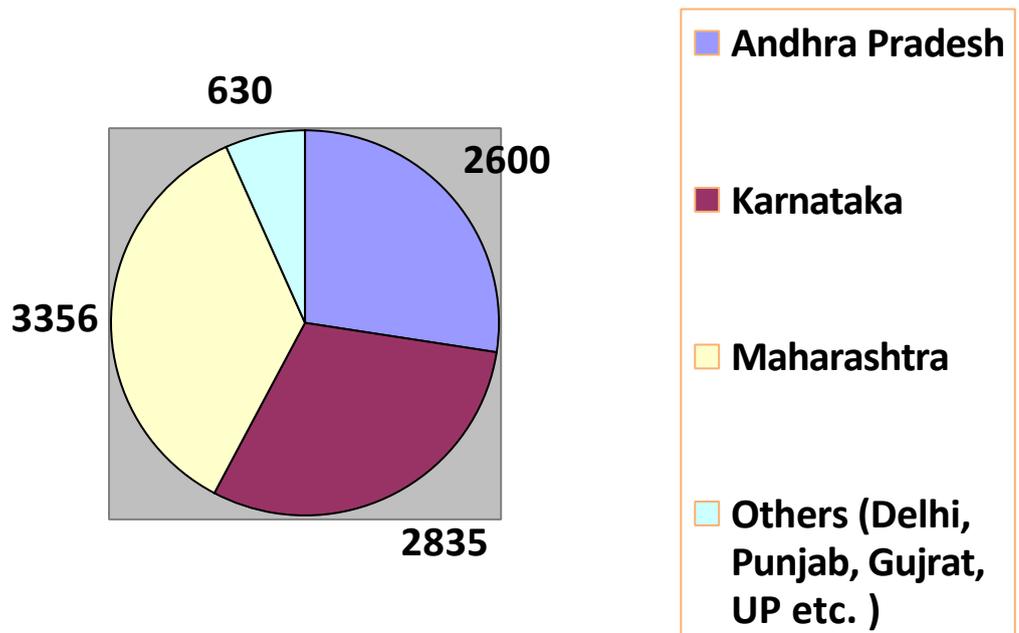
Tamilnadu is followed by Maharashtra which has about 9 colleges that come under top 100 all over India. Again the maximum seats are reserved for state Candidates.

Karnataka boasts of 8 colleges in top 100 colleges in the country. 7 of these colleges are run by Private Trust. Under COMED-K, an entrance test which outside Karnataka State candidates can appear for, 25% seats are

filled based on the merits irrespective of the state from which the candidate come from. States like Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Gujarat have only 1 or 2 institute per state in the top 100 colleges and majority of seats are reserved for respective state candidates.

State level approximate distribution of seats among different states can be given as follows: These are the approximate seats available for state candidates only For e.g Students from Karnataka state have approximate 2835 seats exclusively reserved and like wise for other states.

To sum up we have approximately 32,000 seats from different institutes for ALL INDIA candidates, which can be divided as:  
 Seats in IITS for General Candidates: 4,500

Seats in NITs for General category open to ALL INDIA & respective State Candidates: 6,100

Top Deemed Universities: 20,000

Other Top Govt. Institutes: 500

Colleges under COMED-K and Institute level seats in Private colleges in different states: 3,000

Total seats available in TOP 100 engineering colleges hence accumulate to about 32,000 for which we have approximately 10 lakh applicants. These institutes accommodate only top 32,000 students but the remaining lakhs of students look for other good opportunities available.
