



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



Why study this degree?

USQ's Bachelor of Aviation will prepare you for a successful career in the dynamic aviation industry. You will gain a broad understanding of the industry, and study areas in project management, airline and airport operations, flight training, international aviation law, and safety management systems. Our Bachelor of Aviation also includes professional development workshops where you can build your resume and learn from airline and air force instructor pilots and managers.

The Qantas Group Future Pilot Program is open to USQ Aviation students, and provides access to experienced pilots during their degree. Selected students will be invited to complete an intensive 12-week Airline Transition Course.

Professional accreditation

For **Flight Operations** major students, once you have completed your year of flight training with a registered training organisation flight school, you will gain professional pilot qualifications issued by the Australian Civil Aviation Safety Authority.

Upon successful completion of the Qantas Group Future Pilot Program, graduates can transition to employment with QantasLink to complete their training and become qualified as first officers.

Your aviation studies will equip you for careers as an aviation specialist in either aviation operations, scheduling, human resources, airport and airline operations, or a pilot for Flight Operations major students.

Why study this degree?

USQ's Bachelor of Business and Commerce gives you the flexibility to combine one business area of interest with another to create the career you want, and is designed to give you practical skills and knowledge to identify, describe, analyse and resolve business problems. Benefit from USQ's close ties with industry, and have the opportunity to complete a course (subject) of professional work experience where you'll work with an organisation to complete a project.

Professional accreditation

Accounting graduates will meet the educational entrance requirements of CPA Australia, and Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand. This will allow you to apply for Associate membership of CPA Australia, eligibility to study the CPA Australia professional exams, and eligibility to study the CAANZ professional exams.

Successful completion of the **Accounting** major can also qualify students for exemptions from the Fundamental level (nine papers) of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) exams.

The **Accounting** major is accredited by the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA) and the Association of International Accountants (AIA).

Accounting major students who complete a Finance minor will meet the educational entrance requirements of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia (FINSIA).

Graduates of the **Accounting (Extended)** major will be eligible to apply for membership to the Tax Practitioners Board.

Finance major graduates will meet the educational entrance requirements to become a member of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia (FINSIA).

The **Human Resource Management** major is accredited by the Australian Human Resources Institute (AHRI) and satisfies the educational requirements for professional membership of AHRI.

The **Information Technology Management** major is accredited at professional level by the Australian Computer Society and is recognised in other countries through the Seoul Accord.

The **Marketing** major is accredited by the Australian Marketing Institute (AMI), and students are eligible for credit towards becoming a Certified Practising Marketer (CPM) upon completion.
