- 1. The Questions under Section (A) will be generally of Senior Secondary to Degree level.
- 2. Question in section (A) will be bilingual in Hindi & English. For Section (B) the questions will also be bilingual in Hindi & English except for the post of PGT (Languages) i.e. Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Punjabi & Urdu which would be in the concerned language only.
- 3. There will be a deduction of 0.25 marks for every wrong answer. No marks shall be awarded for the un-attempted questions.

Questions will also be designed to test knowledge of current affairs and of such matters of everyday observation and experience in their scientific respect as may be expected of an

educated person. The test will include questions relating to Indian Society, Socio-Economic and Development Issues, Human Rights, Social Conflicts, Disabilities,

Geo-Cultural aspects in Education. It will also include questions on India and its neighboring countries especially pertaining to History, Geography, Economics, Polity and Constitution, Art & Culture, General Science and Scientific Research, National/International Organizations/Institutions. The syllabus for General Intelligence includes questions of both verbal and non-verbal types. Test may include questions on analogies, similarities, differences, space visualization, problem solving, analysis, judgment, decision making, visual memory, discrimination, observation, relationship, concepts, arithmetical reasoning, verbal and figure classification, arithmetical number series etc. The test also includes questions designed to test the candidate's abilities to deal with abstract ideas and symbols and their relationships, arithmetical computations and other analytical functions. For the test Arithmetical Abilities will cover Number System including questions on Simplification, Decimals, Fractions, L.C.M., H.C.F., Patio & Proportion, Percentage, Average, Profit & Loss, Discount, Simple & Compound Interest, Mensuration, Time & Work, Time & Distance, Tables & Graphs, etc. This section will also include questions on Communication Skills, Education Psychology & Technology, Teaching and Learning Processes and related topics.

PART-II

Part-II will consist of Descriptive type Questions on the concerned subject of 200 marks and to be answered in 150 minutes in the space provided in the Question-Answer Booklet.

The syllabus for Cognitive Ability, Logic and Reasoning includes questions of both verbal and non-verbal types i.e. questions on analogies, similarities, differences, space visualization, problem solving, analysis, judgment, decision making, visual memory, discrimination, observation, relationship, concepts, arithmetical reasoning, verbal and figure classification, arithmetical number series etc. The test Arithmetical Ability will cover Number System including questions on Simplification, Decimals, Fractions, L.C.M., H.C.F., Ratio & Proportion, Percentage, Average, Profit & Loss, Discount, Simple & Compound Interest, Mensuration, Time & Work, Time & Distance, Tables & Graphs, etc. This section will also include Educational Psychology / Technology, Teaching and Learning Processes and related topics. This section will also include questions on testing of candidate's understanding of Hindi Language, its Vocabulary, Grammar, Sentence Structure, Synonyms, Antonyms and its correct usage etc.

PART-II

Part-II will consist of Descriptive type Questions on the concerned subjects of 200 marks to be answered in 150 minutes in the space provided in the Question Answer Booklet.

COMMON INSTRUCTIONS FOR PGT AND TGT CANDIDATES BOTH:

- 1. In Part-II, the candidates will have to write the answers in either Hindi or English except for the post of TGT/PGT (Languages) i.e. Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Punjabi & Urdu (whichever is applicable) for which the answers are to be given in the concerned language only, at the space provided on the Question Answer Booklet itself. The medium of writing the answers must be specified on the Question Answer Booklet at the space provided. They will not be given any additional answer sheets.
- 2. The questions will be bilingual in Hindi & English wherever necessary i.e. except the language posts.

- 3. The merit list will be prepared based on performance in both Part-I & Part-II papers taken together.
- 4. In case of Post Codes 97/2006 & 98/2006 i.e. P.G.T. (Physical Education) and 100/2006 i.e. Music Teacher, candidates who qualify in the written test (Objective & Descriptive both) will, if required, have to undergo a Skill Test which will be of qualifying nature.

5. Visually Handicapped:

- (a) Low Vision candidates will be allowed to bring magnifying glasses which are to be arranged by themselves.
- (b) Blind Candidates: These candidates will have to bring their own scribe (writer) but the qualification of the scribe should be one level below the qualification prescribed for the post applied for. A prescribed proforma in this regard will be sent to the blind candidate along with his Admit Card. The filled in proforma of the scribe and relevant documents have to be submitted in the office of the Board on the dates indicated in the 'Notice of Examination' personally by the candidates and obtain the Identity Card of the scribe. 50 minutes extra shall be given in addition to the normal time allowed of 150 minutes.

- 7. The detailed 'General Instructions to Candidates' regarding the conduct of examination will be sent along with the Admit Card.
