

1. GENERAL

This Bulletin contains essential information for all those who have passed the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi, or an Examination recognized as equivalent thereto and wish to seek admission to various undergraduate courses offered by University of Delhi through its various colleges.

Details of courses offered, minimum eligibility conditions and admission procedure are outlined in the subsequent sections of this Bulletin. Effort has

been made to summarize all vital information. However, clarifications for any specific case for which guidelines are not provided herein may be obtained from the college/department.

Candidates seeking admission on the basis of Sports or ECA and those seeking admission to courses based on Entrance Test are required to contact the concerned college/department.

Candidates seeking admission to Hostel may contact the College concerned directly.

2. COURSES OFFERED

Undergraduate courses are offered by the University through its affiliated colleges in three major streams of studies namely Arts / Humanities, Commerce and Science. The same are summarized below:

2.1 Arts / Humanities

- Bachelor of Arts
- Bachelor of Arts [Vocational]
- Bachelor of Arts [Honours]

2.2 Commerce

- Bachelor of Commerce
- Bachelor of Commerce [Honours]

2.3 Mathematical Sciences

- Bachelor of Science - Mathematical Sciences
- Bachelor of Science [Honours] - Mathematics

- Bachelor of Science [Honours] - Statistics
- Bachelor of Science [Honours] - Comp. Science

2.4 Sciences and Applied Sciences

- Bachelor of Science [Honours] – Physics / Chemistry / Botany / Zoology / Anthropology / Geology / Home Science / Bio-Medical Science / Bio-Chemistry/ Microbiology / Electronics / Biological Sciences / Polymer Sciences.
- Bachelor of Science - Physical Sciences / Life Sciences / Applied Physical Sciences / Applied Life Sciences
- Bachelor of Applied Science [Honours]– Instrumentation / Food Technology.
- Bachelor of Science (Pass) - Home Science

3. REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

3.1 Qualifying Examinations

Qualifying examinations for the purpose of admission to the first year of undergraduate courses offered by the University shall be

Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

Candidate seeking admission to the courses offered by the University should have passed the qualifying examination obtaining minimum marks as specified for each of the courses in subsequent sections.

3.2 Age Requirement

There is no minimum age bar for admission to undergraduate courses in the University and its colleges except in professional courses where regulatory body prescribes minimum age requirement (such as MCI, AICTE, etc.)

3.3 Equivalence Criteria

The applications for admission to the Under-Graduate Courses in the Colleges in respect of candidates belonging to the Examining bodies of Boards / Universities recognized / accredited by the Association of Indian University / University Grants Commission / Ministry of Human Resource Development shall be considered by the College / Department in terms of the following recommendations as circulated in the University circular letter of 13 - 1- 2005.

- 3.3.1 That various degrees from Universities recognized by the Association of Indian Universities / University Grants Commission / Ministry of Human Resource Development or by any bilateral agreement be considered as equivalent to corresponding degrees of University of Delhi

subject to the conditions that course duration is same as in Delhi University for purposes of determining eligibility for admission to various courses and further Departments / Colleges may be allowed to evolve procedure through their respective Admission Committees.

- 3.3.2. Senior School Certificate of various Boards recognized by Association of Indian Universities / Central Board of Secondary Education, be considered as equivalent to the Senior School Certificate of Central Board for purposes of eligibility to various Undergraduate Courses.
- 3.3.3. Students who pass various Degree / School Examination of Foreign Universities / Boards as have already been approved by the Equivalence Committee, from time to time, be considered eligible as a matter of routine.

The cases of only those candidates who do not fall in the list of Association of Indian Universities / University Grants Commission/ Ministry of Human Resource Development recognized accredited Boards / Universities shall be referred to the University on the basis of individual merit.

3.3.4. Grade Conversion

[As per AC Reso. No. 319, dt. 22.3.1976] :

Formula/equivalence of the grade point average awarded in Cambridge School Certificate/ Malayalam/Overseas/African G.C.E./Examination School Certificate Examination and / or 12th Grade Examination of American Embassy School, New Delhi with the percentage of marks as are awarded in the Higher Secondary Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education New Delhi, for the purpose of admission to different Courses in the University.

3.3.5. Admission for IB Students

Relevant Extracts from the Minutes of the Equivalence Committee Meeting held on 21.6.2004

The Committee considered the issue of equivalence to convert grade point average of the diploma awarded by the International Baccalaureate Organisation, Geneva, Switzerland and percentage of marks awarded in the Senior School Certificate Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, for purpose of admission to different courses in the University. The Committee noted that the IB Diploma is already approved as being equivalent to 10+2 level school leaving certificate by the University of Delhi

The Committee also felt that in order to alleviate the hardship being faced by students seeking admission in University, the equivalence formula issued and certified by the institution last attended by the student may be accepted on a provisional basis for granting admission by colleges. In such cases, the principle for calculating the equivalent marks on a scale of 1 to 100, the mid point of the range indicated for a particular grade awarded by the International Baccalaureate Organisation shall be taken as the equivalent marks.

Note :

- a. For admission to an under-graduate course, where a particular subject or a group of subjects is required for admission, the candidate must have passed in the subject/each of the subjects concerned individually.
- b. For additional requirements, if any, prescribed by the various Colleges, consult the Bulletin of Information of respective colleges.

3.4.2. Students from Vocational / Technical Streams

Minimum requirements for the students who have passed the qualifying examinations from Vocational / Technical streams are summarized below:

↘ B.A. / B.Com.

The students who have passed the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi under Vocational / Technical stream will be eligible for admission to the B.A. / B.Com. Courses.

↘ Courses Other than B.A. and B.Com.

- For admission to courses such as B.Com. [Hons] / B.A. [Hons] / B.Sc. [General] Mathematical Sciences three Academic subjects and one Vocational subject may be taken into account for purpose of determining eligibility for admission to these courses. Please refer to Table II below for a list of Academic and Vocational Subjects, being taught at Senior Secondary level (10+2).
- For admission to Vocational Courses, two vocational subjects and two academic subjects will form the basis for admission irrespective of the subjects, but the relationship with the main course must be ensured.
- Academic and Vocational subjects must have the relationship with the main Courses opted by the candidates.
- The case of candidates having passed +2 stage examination with all the vocational subjects may be decided by the Head of the Department/Deans of Faculties concerned, on Individual merit.
- The eligibility for admission to the courses mentioned above shall be the same as prescribed by the University for these Courses except the B.Com. (Hons.) Course. The students who have secured 60% marks and above in aggregate shall be eligible for admission to this course i.e., B.Com. (Hons.).

Further Details:

- Wherever G.C.E. Certificate indicates the grades, it will be treated at par with the grades of Indian School Certificate Examination for purposes of Admission requirements. (See Grade conversion on page 2)
- The Candidates seeking admission to an Honours Course must have passed the subject at Advanced level. For Geology and Anthropology Honours Courses, the candidate must have passed one Science subject at Advanced level out of Physics / Chemistry / Mathematics / Biology.
- The Candidate seeking admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Course in Physics / Chemistry must have passed :
 - Mathematics and Addl. Mathematics at Ordinary level and at least one subject at Advanced Level out of (1) Pure Mathematics (2) Applied Mathematics (3) Mathematics (Pure and Applied) and (4) Further Mathematics OR (6) Addl. Mathematics at Ordinary Level and one subject Advanced level out of (1) Pure Mathematics (2) Applied Mathematics (3) Mathematics (Pure and Applied) (4) Further Mathematics.

OR

 - Addl. Mathematics at Ordinary Level and one subject at Advanced level out of (1) Pure Mathematics (2) Applied Mathematics (3) Mathematics (Pure and Applied) (4) Further Mathematics.

University of Delhi offers non-formal stream of education through School of Open Learning. The Courses Offered are B.A(Prog.), B.Com(Prog.), B.Com(Hons.), B.A(Hons.) English and B.A(Hons.)Political Science

3.5 Entrance Test for Admission

Candidates are advised to contact the concerned College in case an Entrance Test is prescribed for admission to any particular Course and obtain details thereof.

3.6 Rechecking/Revaluation and Compartment Cases

- a. The colleges shall consider admission of the candidates whose marks get increased in the process of rechecking/revaluation by their respective boards within the prescribed period of admission provided that such a candidate fulfills the other eligibility conditions laid down for admission.
- b. Candidates placed under compartment in one subject only at the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto of any statutory University/Board will be eligible for provisional admission in Colleges, School of Open Learning and Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board, if they obtain the required minimum percentage of marks in the aggregate by adding the minimum pass marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed under compartment to the marks obtained in remaining subjects.
- c. Candidates who fail to appear or fail to pass at the Compartmental examination by December of the Year of admission shall not be entitled to continue on rolls and their provisional admission will be cancelled without any further reference to them.
- d. Candidates placed in Compartment in one/two subjects at the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination or an equivalent examination who are not eligible for provisional admission to regular Colleges and the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board under clause a) may, after clearing their compartmental Examination and securing at least 40% marks be admitted in a College before the prescribed last date, subject to availability of seat.

NOTE : The Candidate placed in compartment will not be considered for admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Courses under the Faculty of Science.

3.7 Procedure for Admission to First Year

Admission to all courses offered by the University and

listed under Section 2 of this Bulletin shall be made in accordance with the following guidelines:

3.7.1 Admission to the Regular Colleges

All those who satisfy the Course/Marks conditions laid down in the foregoing sections are eligible to seek admission in the Colleges. However, the Colleges may continue admission till 23rd July, 2011 subject to availability of seats. For admission guidelines refer to Appendix-6. For further information with regard to admission to a particular College, the candidates are advised to contact the concerned College.

3.7.2 Admission to the School of Open Learning

All those who satisfy the conditions laid down in the foregoing sections shall be eligible to seek admission to B.A. (Hons) English/Political Science and B.Com (Hons) Course in the School of Open Learning up to 30th September, 2011. Every candidate who has passed the last qualifying examination as laid down in Table II is eligible for admission to B.A. and B.Com Courses. For further information, the candidates are advised to contact the **Executive Director, School of Open Learning (Campus of Open Learning), 5, Cavalry Lane, Delhi-110007.**

3.7.3 Enrolment in the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board

Women candidates who satisfy the requirements as specified in the foregoing sections can get themselves enrolled with the Teaching Centre of Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board for admission to B.A./B.Com course. For further information and procedure for admission, the candidates are advised to contact the **Director, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board, Tutorial Building, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007.**

3.8 Refund of Fees

- i) If a student withdraws his/her admission on or before 16 August, 2011 he/she may be refunded the fee after deducting Rs. 1000/- as processing fee, in the case of self financing courses for the year 2011-2012 as per DU circular 2007.
- ii) In so far as other courses are concerned, the rules regarding refund of fee as approved by the Executive Council and circulated to the Colleges on 26.7.1989 have to be followed in toto.
