

INTRODUCTION

The Education Department of Chandigarh Administration supervises the functioning of four Govt. Arts and Science colleges in Chandigarh. These colleges are built on spacious campuses with the latest laboratories, equipments, sprawling grounds and auditoria. The colleges cater to the needs of a cross section of the student community not only from Chandigarh but also from S.A.S. Nagar and Panchkula. Some students of other states namely Delhi, Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, Jammu and Kashmir, Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh also seek admission in these colleges, attracted by the quality education and excellent infrastructures.

All these colleges are affiliated to Panjab University. The highly qualified faculty and dedicated ministerial and other staff have made these colleges true sanctuaries of good education to instruct the students in their formative years. The colleges run courses in Arts, Commerce, Science, Computer Education, Biotechnology, Information Technology and Business Administration disciplines. Three of these colleges have postgraduate courses in Information Technology, Economics, English, Public Administration, Commerce, Music Instrumental, Music Vocal and Dance. Besides, a number of vocational subjects such as Functional English, Principles and Practices of Insurance and Advertising, Sales Promotion and Sales Management are also available in these colleges. Information Technology Programme (C-TOSS) has also been started in all the colleges for imparting I.T. Education in collaboration with SPIC, Chandigarh and I.T. Department, Chandigarh Administration.

All the four colleges provide hostel facilities to the resident students. These hostels are modern in concept but traditional in maintaining discipline. The faculty in all the colleges endeavours its best to provide a congenial atmosphere in the hostels. The playgrounds of all the colleges hum with activity as many sportsmen and women get training and excel. Two Youth Festivals are organized every year to harness the artistic and creative talents of the students.

With the well stocked libraries having the latest books and the journals, all these colleges provide an academically excellent environment for both the students and the teachers. The respective college magazines are published once a year and the creative talent of students is depicted in the pages of these magazines. The colleges have NSS units which train the students in social welfare activities.

NCC units of the colleges impart training to the NCC cadets and instil discipline in them.

The colleges also organize a regular number of blood donation camps in collaboration with the P.G.I.'s Blood Bank Society.

In short, these colleges provide a spectrum of academic and other activities in tune with the nature of Chandigarh, the city being an epicentre of educational landscape in Northern India.

COMMON FEATURES OF ALL THE COLLEGES

The colleges have various courses as detailed in their respective portions of this Prospectus

Admission :

HOW TO APPLY FOR ADMISSION

1. Fill a separate Admission Form for each college and each course.
2. Students applying for admission to more than one course or college should submit a separate Admission Form for each course/college.
3. Application for admission to the college must be made on the prescribed form.
4. Application for admission must be accompanied by the attested copies of :
 - (i) Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - (ii) Matriculation/Sr. Secondary Certificate showing date of birth.
 - (iii) Board/University Certificate showing the previous examination passed.
5. Every candidate seeking admission will paste one copy of his/her passport size photograph at the place specified on the Admission Form.
6. Application for admission must be submitted within the specified period as given by the colleges in their respective portions. Application incomplete in any respect or received in the office, after the expiry of due date shall not be entertained. Please collect the Acknowledgement Slip from the college where you are applying for admission.

GENERAL RULES OF ADMISSION

1. Candidates and their parents/guardians are expected to read the Prospectus carefully before applying for admission. Find out the page of the relevant course and the college where you want to apply.
2. Admission to the various classes is made strictly on MERIT, in accordance with the Panjab University and the U.T. Government rules. The merit shall be determined on the basis of marks in all the subjects taken up by the candidates. In case the marks of two or more students are the same, the age factor would decide the merit, the older the senior.
3. The admission forms shall have separate columns for father's and mother's names. The name of mother alongwith the name of father shall be mentioned in all the records. However, in cases, some students do not wish to declare the name of both the parents (either of mother or father) they may not be insisted upon and no one be denied admission on this ground.
4. For admission, fraction of marks less than the requisite percentage would not be rounded off to the advantage of the candidates, i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% shall not be rounded off to 33%, 40% and 50% etc.
5. Failed students from any institution shall not be admitted to any of the colleges.
6. It shall be the sole discretion of the Principal/Admission Committee to admit or not to admit the detained students of the college.
7. Students disqualified by any University/Board shall not be admitted to the colleges. Such students need not apply for admission.

8. In case of late declaration of result by the Panjab University, the normal admission will take place within 10 working days of the declaration of result subject to the availability of seats. This rule will not apply to a candidate who passes the lower examination from any other University/Board. It means that those students whose result is declared late by the University other than Panjab University shall not be allowed late admission to these colleges under any circumstances.
9. Candidates with a break in their studies will not be admitted to any college until the gap is explained to the satisfaction of the Principal of the concerned college.
10. The Principal's decision shall be final and binding regarding interpretation of rules for admission. Notwithstanding any rule incorporated in the Prospectus, the Principal of a college reserves the right of admission.
11. In case the conduct of a student during the session is not satisfactory, the Principal has every right to cancel his/her admission.

Deficient Subjects

Rules regarding deficient subject/subjects for candidates coming from **universities (other than Panjab University, Chandigarh) of Punjab State**, seeking admission in B.A./B.Sc./B. Com. Part II and III are as follows :—

(a) The applicants must seek clarification from the Admission Committee about the deficient subject/subjects and the same must be cleared by them within two consecutive chances as per the Panjab University rules.

(b) If a candidate is being admitted in the III year of B.A./B.Sc./B. Com., he/she will have to clear the deficient subject/subjects of 1st year and 2nd year of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. as the case may be wherever applicable.

(c) However, candidates coming from **universities of other States (other than Punjab State)** will be given admission only if there is no deficient subject in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part I and II as the case may be.

Admission Committee will certify on the Admission Form regarding 'No Deficient Subject'.

LATE ADMISSIONS

1) The permission of the Vice-Chancellor is necessary for admission after the expiry of the last date. Late fee has to be paid at the university fee counter and the receipt should be attached with the Admission Form.

2) A student whose result of +2 examination conducted by a School Board is published late, but not later than 10th August of the year of admission, may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result **depending upon the availability of seats and the fact that the Admission Form has been deposited as Result Awaited Case by the last date of submission of Admission Forms**. The attendance of such a student shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to an Open School Board also. After expiry of this period, the late admission approval from the Vice-Chancellor is required.

In the case of the Panjab University students who have already appeared in any of its examinations and the result is declared late, admission to them to the next class/course may be allowed within 10 working days from the date of declaration of the result without charging any late fee.

RESERVATION POLICY

Reservation of Seats

Reservation of seats in different categories viz, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Dependents of Defence and Paramilitary Personnel, Freedom Fighters, Physically Challenged, and Sports will be made in accordance with the rules and instructions framed by the Chandigarh Administration from time to time.

A candidate applying in a reserved category shall carefully indicate his/her claim for only one category in the Admission Form. In case the candidate wrongly indicates claim for more than one reserved category, the one claimed in the first instance shall be considered. No change of category will be entertained/permitted in the Application Form or otherwise at a later stage.

As per letter No. 19/1/93/IH(3)5311 dated 18th March, 1999 from Home Secretary, Chandigarh Administration, the following policy shall be followed as regards reservation of seats.

1. In continuation of this Administration's circular letter No. 19/1/93/IH(3-99/11136) dated 9th June, 1999 on the above subject, which inter alia provides that 85% seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institution will be filled up from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from schools/colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory, Chandigarh as regular students of the said school/college subject to the condition that such students must have studied in Chandigarh and have passed one lower qualifying examination from these schools/colleges which will be termed as U.T. POOL, and the remaining 15% seats will be filled from amongst students, who pass their qualifying examinations from the institutions other than those located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh or otherwise, which will be termed as 'GENERAL POOL'.

Note :—In the U.T. Pool qualifying examination means +2 or equivalent examination from U.T. Chandigarh recognized schools & for Post graduate classes, a Bachelor's degree or a Post graduate degree from recognized Chandigarh colleges.

2. It is clarified that since in the General Pool quota, the students who have passed their qualifying examination otherwise are also eligible for admission, the students, whether belonging to reserved category or not, who have passed their qualifying examination from the institutions located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh but are not eligible for admission under the U.T. POOL quota, are eligible for admission in the GENERAL POOL quota.

(a) Reservation of Seats (for all the classes)

Note :—The reservation is out of 85% seats of U.T. Pool and 15% seats of General Pool.

2) For reservation of seats i.e. 85% and 15%, the latest decision of the Chandigarh Administration at the time of admission will be binding.

(b) Reservation for Dependents of Defence/Para-military Personnel etc. on the following priority :

(a) Sons/daughters/spouses of Defence personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of Paramvir/Mahavir/Vir Chakra in person or posthumously.

OR

Sons/daughters/spouses of Defence personnel and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc who are killed or are totally incapacitated in action while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

(b) Sons/daughters/spouses of Defence personnel and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who died while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

(c) Sons/daughters/spouses of Defence personnel and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. incapacitated while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

(d) Sons/daughters/spouses of ex-servicemen (Defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc.) who are wholly dependent on them.

(e) Sons/daughters/spouses of serving persons (Defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc.) who are wholly dependent on them.

Panjab University Regulations

Refer to Panjab University Letter No. 7751-7780/Misc./A-6, dated 14-8-2003.

Policy regarding reservation of seats in admission to educational/technical/medical institutions under the control of Chandigarh Administration-amendment thereof.

For the purpose of reservation to the category 'Paramilitary Forces', wherever applicable, this category shall include wards of personnel serving in the Intelligence Bureau, National Security Guards, and Special Services Bureau at par with the wards of employees of other Para Military Forces, in consonance with the circular issued by Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 27011/9/98-PF-I dated 26-5-1998.

(c) Reservation for the Physically Challenged

The physically challenged student will furnish a medical certificate issued by the Principal Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon of Chandigarh or his concerned district, indicating percentage of disability whether he/she is otherwise able to carry on the studies and perform the duties in the respective course, name of the disease/handicap, whether handicap is temporary or permanent, whether handicap is progressive. The students having temporary handicap would not be considered against the reserved seats for physically challenged, where the certificate is issued by any authority, any other than the Principal Medical Officer of Chandigarh and the candidate's turn comes for admission against reserved seats for physically challenged, the concerned Head of the institution shall refer the candidate to the Principal Medical Officer, Chandigarh and shall admit the candidate only after confirmation from the P.M.O., Chandigarh.

(d) Reservation for the Wards of the Freedom Fighters

Note : 2% seats in each pool would be filled from the children and grand children of the Freedom Fighters.

(e) Concession to the Wards of Kashmiri Displaced Persons

Concession to the wards of Kashmiri Displaced Persons for admission to various courses in the educational institutions for the academic session 2005-06. Refer to Panjab University letter No. Misc./A-6/3071-3285, dated 6-4-2005. It has been decided that 5% intake should be given subject to maximum of 3 seats (to be treated as additional seat(s) per course at the entry point be made in all the courses at under graduate and post-graduate level in all the Arts and Science affiliated Colleges and Panjab University Teaching Departments wherever the reservation policy approved by the University is applicable.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS ABOUT RESERVATION POLICY

Note : In order to give implementation to the above reservation policy, it is however, clarified as under :—

(a) The students belonging to above reserved categories admitted on the basis of these merits in the general category will not be accounted for towards the seats reserved for the categories concerned.

(b) The student who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which he/she applies for admission, maintaining his/her inter se seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in each category. In such case, the student will get the benefit in one category of his/her choice. However, no further reservation shall be allowed within the reserved categories.

(c) The student belonging to the above categories will also be considered in the general category according to his/her merit.

(d) All candidates seeking admission except in the case of Chandigarh Medical College and Punjab Engineering College (where the existing practice shall continue) will furnish an undertaking as under along with their application form :

I certify that I have no such physical handicap/disability which would hinder the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission. If at a later stage it is found that I have a physical handicap/disability which hinders the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission then my admission will be liable to be cancelled.

In case of any doubt or interpretation of any item or these instructions the matter shall be referred to the Chandigarh Administration whose decision shall be final.

Any change in the policy for reservation of seats etc. for admission of different categories by the Chandigarh Administration will be available with the different concerned committees.

SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS ABOUT THE RESERVATION POLICY :

Note-I—Rules of Reservation Policy existing at the time of admission will be applicable.

Note II—As per letter No. 2457-2657/misc/A-6 dated 11-4-2003 from the Registrar, P.U., CHD, weightage of marks to N.C.C. certificate holders for admission to affiliated colleges w.e.f. the academic session 2003-2004 shall be as under :

Certificate A : 1% B:2% C:3%

“maximum weightage of the marks of 4% for distinction in any or all the co-curricular activities shall be maintained.”

GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO THE RESERVED CATEGORIES OF SPORTS

This will be as per rules and regulations of Sports Dept. of the Chandigarh Administration vide Home Secretary letter No. 8493, dated 5-5-2003. In order to give implementation to the policy it is, however, clarified as under :—

1. Two per cent of the total number of seats in each course shall be filled up with sportsmen/sportswomen. These two per cent seats shall be reserved in each of Engineering/Non-Engineering courses in the institutions on the basis of total intake of each branch and the fraction of 0.5 or above shall be rounded off to the next higher number. This category shall not be divided into U.T. pool/General pool. The inter merit of the candidates seeking admission in any course in the reserved category of sports shall be determined only on the basis of their merits in sports as per grading criteria mentioned. In case any of the seats in the sports category in any branch remains unfilled, the same shall be thrown open to the candidates of general category. This policy is for the players of the Chandigarh only.

2. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category of students :

(a) Those who pass their qualifying examination from Schools/Colleges, recognised by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as regular students of the said Schools/Colleges and have studied in Chandigarh Schools/Colleges for the qualifying examinations before applying for gradation certificate, subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh State/Schools etc. in the National/other recognised tournaments.

(b) Where the Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other States/U.T. on reciprocal basis, to give benefit of reservation in admission in sports category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per the existing policy of the Chandigarh Administration.

(c) Countersigning of the Gradation certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that countersigned certificates will be graded as per the policy of the Chandigarh Administration.

3. Students seeking admission to this category shall be considered only :

(a) If his/her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in Inter-College/Inter University Tournaments.

(b) If his/her achievement in sports relates to his/her activity in any of the three years preceding the year of admission. (for example, for admission in the year 2005-06, the achievements shall not be prior to April, 2002).

(c) Gradation Certificate will not be meant for employment purposes.

4. The Director Sports, Chandigarh Administration, or his nominee, not below the rank of the Joint Director, Sports will issue the certificate, and also have the authority to cancel any certificate at any time, if it is found to have been issued on false/incorrect/concealed information or record.

The merit of certificates shall be graded as 'A', 'B', 'C', 'D' in the descending order. Details of these grades are available with the admission committees of all the colleges.

INTERVIEWS

All the candidates found eligible for admission shall be interviewed by the Admission Committee on the dates notified in the Prospectus. For seeking admission, a candidate must present himself/herself for interview before the Admission Committee. A candidate who does not attend the interview shall not be admitted. Only a candidate for a hostel seat should be accompanied by his/her parents/guardian. Certificates/ testimonials in original must be produced at the time of interview.



IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING ADMISSION AND GENERAL CONDUCT

All the admissions to these colleges are provisional and subject to the approval of the Panjab University. The college will not be held responsible in case the university does not approve the admission of the student i.e. for giving incomplete information, concealing necessary facts or attaching incomplete testimonials or choosing wrong combination of subjects, or delayed submission of certificates etc. The payment of any fine/penalty imposed by the P.U. for any default in this regard shall be the personal responsibility of the students.

Students are advised to keep a photocopy of the Submitted (filled) Admission Form for future reference at the time of admission.

In case of doubt, parents/guardians/students are requested to consult and confirm the eligibility for admission so that hardships/rejections are avoided later on.

Students are advised to see the notices displayed on the various notice boards. Displayed notices on the various notice boards are deemed to have been served on the students.

Any other instruction or rule received from the DPI (Colleges) U.T., Chandigarh Administration/P.U., after the publication of this Prospectus will be binding on students. A copy of any new instructions will be available with the Admission Committee/Office.

In case any student is found to have supplied false information or certificates etc, or is found to have withheld or concealed any information in the application form, the student's name would be removed from the college and all fees and other dues paid by him/her up to the date of such removal would be forfeited. The college authorities may take any further action against the student and his/her parents/guardian that it considers suitable as per rules.

Every college has a committee to prevent "Sexual Harassment" of Women and for the preservation and enforcement of rights to gender equality of working women. A committee headed by a senior lecturer holds its meeting periodically and female students and employees of these colleges can seek help in case of any sexual harassment.

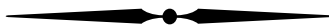


GENERAL DISCIPLINE

Students are expected to maintain proper discipline in and outside the class room/college. The following instructions should be noted for strict compliance :—

RAGGING IS STRICTLY BANNED : Any student found indulging in ragging, committing or abetting ragging shall be punished/rusticated/expelled/suspended from the college. Ragging includes disorderly conduct whether by words, spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating and handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student. The complainants can directly approach the Principal.

- * **Use of Mobile Phones in the class rooms and the library is strictly prohibited.**
- * Students must keep their vehicles at the cycle/scooter stand. Plying of vehicles on the college campus is not allowed.
- * Students must be punctual in their classes. It is the discretion of the lecturer concerned to admit a late comer or not.
- * Smoking and playing of cards on the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- * Disciplinary action will be taken against those who are found guilty of causing damage to the college property.
- * Students must make it a point to read the Notice Board daily to know the latest notices. Ignorance of orders duly displayed on the Notice Board shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.
- * Students violating rules and resorting to disputes are liable to be punished in the form of heavy fine, withdrawal of concession or stipends and even expulsion from the college in extreme cases.
- * **Students who are under age and do not have a valid driving licence for a two wheeler or a four wheeler are not allowed to drive as per the directions of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court. They are advised not to bring their vehicles in the college.**



STUDENTS FROM OTHER UNIVERSITIES/BOARDS/COLLEGES

Eligibility

- (i) Students are advised to ascertain from the Panjab University their eligibility to the class to which they seek admission. They are also required to furnish the **eligibility certificate** in original alongwith their application form only wherever required.. The college shall not own any responsibility in case the university does not approve their admission.
- (ii) Their admission will be provisional subject to confirmation by the Panjab University. They are, therefore, required to furnish the original certificates within ten days of their admission.
- (iii) Only those who are not covered by the Equivalence chart issued by the Panjab University are required to bring eligibility certificate for Panjab University for TDC I classes.
- (iv) English at +2 Exam. for B.A./B.Sc. (General) Ist Year Class :—

Candidates who have passed +2 exam. without English from any recognised Board/ Body/Council/University, are eligible to join B.A./B.Sc.Part-I if they fulfil other requirements for admission such as minimum percentage of marks etc.

- (v) Regarding Open School +2 Pass Candidate only :—

Students who have passed +2 exam. from recognized Open Schools are eligible for admission to the B.A./B.Sc. (General)/B.Com.-Ist year course only if their result is shown as “PASS” in their certificates issued by the said Open Schools and they have obtained the requisite percentage of marks prescribed under the University Regulations for admission to the concerned course. In case their result has not been shown as “PASS” in the relevant column of the said certificate, they being ineligible, be not admitted.

- (vi) Students from other Universities/Boards seeking admission to the colleges will be admitted on production of the original certificate of examination passed, original inter-university migration certificate and detailed marks certificate at the time of interview.



GENERAL CONDITIONS REGARDING ELIGIBILITY

A booklet containing the information regarding Examinations of other Indian Universities/Boards/Bodies which are recognised by the Panjab University in a printed form can be had from the office of the Deputy Registrar(General) Panjab University, Chandigarh. It will help in making proper admissions.

Only eligible candidates be admitted to the course concerned. The responsibility for making wrong admission or allowing wrong combination of subjects to a student shall lie entirely with the college/department authorities.

The Eligibility Certificate will be issued by the University only in doubtful cases.

In case of any doubt, the candidate may be advised to obtain an Eligibility Certificate from the Panjab University by filling up the requisite form. The requisite Eligibility Fee may also be remitted with the State Bank of India, (Branch, Sector 14), Panjab University, Chandigarh.

No provisional admission shall be made without ascertaining eligibility. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to College/Dept. where he/she is seeking admission.

MIGRATION

- (i) Students from other colleges affiliated to the Panjab University may be allowed to migrate with the prior permission of the concerned Principals and the university. A certificate from the previous college giving details of dues paid and lectures delivered and attended must be produced at the time of admission.
- (ii) No migration will be permitted to a student with a combination of subjects not provided in these colleges.
- (iii) Candidate seeking admission to any college after migration from universities other than the Panjab University shall clear deficient subjects as determined by the College/University.

CHANGE OF SUBJECTS : B.A./B.Sc. I

Change of subjects in B.A./B.Sc. I is not a matter of right. A change will be allowed if seats are available in a particular subject combination.

Students seeking admission to B.A. I are advised to select subjects carefully after due consideration. Change of subjects will be allowed in B.A./B.Sc. I only once and that too depending on the availability of the seats in the particular subject. This option can be exercised by the students of B.A./B.Sc. I within one month of the commencement of the academic session. Applications on the prescribed form for subject change must be routed through the concerned teachers and the In-charge, Change of Subjects.



FOREIGN STUDENTS

The Principals admit a limited number of foreign students to various classes in their colleges on the recommendation of respective admission committees as per the University/College rules. Applications of foreign students for concessional AIR TRAVEL TICKET are forwarded once a year. A limited number of seats may be allowed to foreign students in the college hostels as per the college rules and regulations. However, admission to the hostel cannot be claimed as a matter of right.

The scholarship grant does not cover refundable securities which the foreign students are required to deposit at the time of admission. They must, therefore, bring with them an additional sum of Rs. 10,000/- for the purpose. They are required to pay a Registration Fee of US \$ 370/- at the time of admission.

The following rules shall apply to the foreign students seeking admission in these colleges in addition to the rules governing other students :

- (i) An eligibility certificate from the Panjab University indicating the particular class to which they can be admitted.
- (ii) A certificate of proficiency in English language as per the University rules.
- (iii) A certificate of registration from the local police.
- (iv) Original letters of scholarships in case of those who are Government of India scholars.
- (v) Residential permit.
- (vi) Birth certificate showing date of birth and father's name.
- (vii) Passport/Visa.
- (viii) Original migration certificate.
- (ix) AIDS clearance certificate from the P.G.I., Chandigarh.
- (x) Copies of original as well as attested copies of academic certificates.
- (xi) Other testimonials, if any.

The respective college authorities have the right to reject any admission form and refuse admission if there is any discrepancy in the name, date of birth or even spelling of the names in passport, certificates, testimonials and birth certificate etc.

All the Foreign Students shall obtain the Eligibility Certificate from the Deputy Registrar (General), Panjab University in all the cases and the admission of the foreign students to the college would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean, Foreign Students, Panjab University, Chandigarh.



RULES FOR ELIGIBILITY TO APPEAR IN THE UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

Attendance Requirement :

As per the University Regulations, a student is required to attend at least :-

- (i) 75 per cent of the full course of lectures delivered to his/her class in each subject offered by him/her.
- (ii) 75 per cent of the periods assigned to practical work in each concerned subject.
- (iii) 75 per cent of the tutorials/practicals for B.Com. classes in each of the subjects offered by him/her.

Important Note : *Any change in the eligibility condition would be available with the concerned committees.*

A student who remains absent for more than seven days at a stretch without sanctioned leave is liable to have his/her name struck off from the college rolls.

HOUSE EXAMINATIONS & INTERNAL ASSESSMENT FOR TDC CLASSES

- (i) As per the instructions of Panjab University, Chandigarh, internal assessment based upon September & December Tests is to be sent on the proforma provided by the Panjab University. The assessment is based on 4% marks in September Test and 6% in December Test in each paper of all the subjects of B.A. I, II, III; B.Sc. I, II, III; B. Com. I, II, III and B.C.A. I, II, III. In addition to this, for B.Com. I, II, III 10 marks in each paper are reserved for practicals. However, there are no practicals in the subject of Punjabi/HCP in B.Com. I.
 - (a) For B.B.A. I, II & III, the internal assessment is 20%.
 - (b) Absence or exemption from the examination on any ground (even medical) is treated as failure with nil marks.
 - (c) Students found guilty of using unfair means in the house examinations will abide by the decision of the UMC Committee as per rules.
 - (d) A student attending NCC Camps/Sports Cultural Activities will seek prior permission for absence in September/December Tests. He/she may be allowed to appear in Special Test, if held at the discretion of the Principal.
- (ii) A student is required to obtain :
 - (a) A minimum of 25 per cent marks in the aggregate of all subjects in the house examinations to be eligible to appear in the annual university examination.
 - (b) A minimum of marks as per the latest Panjab University rules in the special test, if held, at the discretion of the Principal, subsequent to regular house examinations.

HOUSE EXAMINATIONS & INTERNAL ASSESSMENT FOR POSTGRADUATE CLASSES

House Examinations and Internal Assessment for all the Postgraduate Courses will be as per the Panjab University rules. The internal assessment will be as follows :

M.A. = 20%, M.Sc. (IT) = 25% and M.Com. = 50%

For M.Sc. (IT) House Examinations and Internal Assessment will be as per the Panjab University regulations.

For M.A. and M.Com. classes, the detail of assessment is as below :

As per the Panjab University letter No. 4251-4400/GM dated 05-04-2005 the internal assessment will be as under :

- (1) Terminal evaluation : 80%
- (2) Continuous assessment : 20%
- (3) Continuous assessment may include written assignments, snap tests, participation in discussions in the class, term papers, attendance etc.

- (4) 20% continuous assessment has been quantified as under :

The same will be based upon class attendance and participation in seminars, case discussions, snap tests, etc. for each paper.

Those who offer practical subjects cannot appear privately.



LEAVE RULES

- (i) Students should apply for leave on the leave application form available in the college office.
- (ii) Prior sanction for leave must be taken. In case of sickness or an emergency, the leave application must be submitted within a week.
- (iii) Application for sick leave for more than five days will have to be supported by a Medical Certificate from a Government Dispensary/Hospital.
- (iv) Absence fine without leave is Re. 1/- per period and Rs. 4/- for the whole day.
- (v) Leave on medical grounds or otherwise does not entitle a student to claim benefit of lectures or for appearing in the Special Test.

LIBRARIES

All the four govt. colleges have got well stocked libraries and the latest books, journals, periodicals and newspapers are available to the students and the staff. There is an open shelf system in all the libraries. Computers are installed and reading material is also available in CDs and Audio Cassettes.

TEXT BOOK LIBRARY

Under the University Grants Commission's schemes for Text Book Library, sets of standard text books are issued to the needy students upto the end of their University Examination.

LIBRARY RULES

- (i) Identity Card/Library Card-cum-Reader's Ticket/PVC Identity Card/Library Card.
As soon as a student is admitted to the college, he/she will be issued an Identity Card/Library Card-cum-Reader's Ticket on production of fee receipt. Four ticket size photographs are to be fixed each on the identity card and membership card, and two on reader's tickets. Every student shall keep his/her identity card on his/her person during his/her stay in the college. A student who fails to produce identity card on demand may be refused entry in the classes/library and may become liable for disciplinary action.
- (ii) Issue of Books
 - (a) Two (Three in case of Hons. and Postgraduate classes) books shall be issued for 14 days.
 - (b) Overdue fine @ Re. 1/- per book per day shall be charged.

WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION / LIBRARY SECURITY

1. Withdrawal of Admission - A student should apply for withdrawal of his or her name failing which the student is liable to pay all college dues.

Until the name is formally withdrawn, the student is liable to pay all college dues and fines. **College Fee/Annual Charges once paid are non-refundable.**

A separate application will have to be submitted for withdrawal from the hostel.

2. Refund and Lapse of Security of Students leaving college - All outgoing students must submit their Library Security Refund Form (available in the Office) to the dealing Assistant of the office.

3. For Students leaving College Mid-Session - Application for refund of security must be made on the prescribed form immediately on leaving the college.

N.B. :- Security will lapse if not claimed within one year of leaving the college.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

TUTORIAL GROUPS

- (a) Each student will be assigned to a tutor who will look after his/her welfare and studies.
- (b) The tutor will maintain a record of the student's conduct, health, attendance and progress in studies as well as his participation in co-curricular activities.
- (c) Tutorial group meetings will be held as notified by the Principal from time to time. Students are advised to see the notice board daily.

EDUCATIONAL TOURS

Subsidized educational tours are undertaken every year by the students under different programmes for data collection, field surveys, visits to industries, business houses, financial institutions, legislatures, libraries, laboratories, training institutes, newspaper offices, educational and social institutions, museums, archeological sites, and places of historical importance. Most of these tours are essential for the course structures, and are guided by the teachers.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

The colleges provide an opportunity to the students to participate in Dramatics, Music, Dance, Painting, Public Speaking and Quiz etc., at the Youth Festivals and Inter College Competitions.

SUBJECT SOCIETIES

In order to tap the talent of the students, subject societies exist in the colleges. These societies hold functions in their respective subjects from time to time during the academic session.

Besides, Youth Services Club, Blood Bank Society and Foreign Students' Association also exist in the colleges.

COLLEGE MAGAZINES

All the colleges publish their college magazine containing original articles by the students. These magazines also cover academic and co-curricular activities of the colleges. The Vikas is published by Govt. College, Sector 11, Chandigarh, The Abha is published by Govt. College for Girls, Sector 11, Chandigarh, The Shikhar is published by Govt. College for Girls, Sector 42, Chandigarh and Amaranth is published by Govt. College, Sector 46, Chandigarh.



N.C.C.

Facility for participation in the National Cadet Corps (Army Wing, Naval Wing and Air Wing) is available for the students. Students are prepared for 'B' and 'C' Certificate examinations so that they may avail themselves of the reserved seats in the I.M.A. meant for N.C.C. 'C' certificate holders.

COLLEGE HOSTELS

There are various hostels attached to these colleges, These hostels are modern in concept and design, having latest amenities. Mostly with cubicles, these hostels have common rooms and guest rooms and amenities like T.V. and newspapers, ceiling fans, geysers, water-coolers, public telephones, indoor and outdoor games, canteens and messes. Each hostel has a teacher warden and supporting staff. **A candidate should apply for a hostel seat along with Admission Form of the college on the prescribed form.**

Old residents should apply afresh for admission. Their merit and their conduct in the hostel in the previous session will be taken into consideration. For old residents of the hostel, it is notified that the admission to the hostel is not a matter of right.

Students seeking admission to the hostels are expected to read all the rules and regulations printed on the back of the hostel admission form. Also binding on them shall be the rules and regulations notified from time to time. A resident student can be asked to vacate the hostel in case of misconduct. Admission to the hostel will be as per rules and regulations.

Special care is taken of the general well-being of the resident students. Every resident student must strictly abide by the Hostel Rules.

Note :- Parents must accompany a student who seeks admission to the hostel for the first time.

Note :- Details of the hostel rules are mentioned in the Hostel Admission Forms of the respective colleges.

HOSTEL RULES

1. For Hostel Admission application on the prescribed form (available in the hostel) is to be made in the student's handwriting and will be dealt with by the Hostel Warden.
2. Allotment of Rooms in the Hostel will be made strictly according to the rules framed by the college.
3. A hostel resident is required to attend 75% of lectures delivered per month failing which he will have to vacate his/her hostel room.
4. **Possession and consumption of liquor and other intoxicants in the hostel shall entail expulsion from the hostel.**
5. All the residents are required to take their meals in the hostel mess. Minimum charges of 40 meals per month will be charged from each resident.
6. No resident will pass on the key of his room to another resident or to an outsider.
7. Internal locks/latch locks are not permitted to be installed in the hostel rooms.
8. If a resident absents himself/herself from classes in the college for seven days continuously without prior permission then he/she will be asked to vacate the hostel seat.
9. A resident whose name has been struck off from the college rolls for any reason will have to vacate the hostel seat.
10. Hostel seat is allotted only for one academic year.

HOSTEL RULES (FOR GCG-11 & GCG-42)

GCG-11 has three hostels providing accommodation for 600 students.

GCG-42 has one hostel providing accommodation for 260 students.

General Rules

1. Hostel Seat is allotted strictly on merit and only for one academic year.
2. Old resident students will be given a hostel seat on the basis of their previous good behaviour in the hostel.
3. Interview for hostel admission before the admission committee will be held after the college admission on the notified dates for admission in the college. Parents have to accompany their ward for interview (even in case of old students). Parents are advised to read the hostel rules carefully before meeting the Principal for an interview.
4. No student will be allowed to stay in the College Hostel during October, December and Summer Vacations (after University Examinations)
5. Students failing to clear their eligibility for the University Examinations as a result of House Examinations/Lecture Shortage will forfeit their hostel seat.
6. Student suffering from a serious/chronic illness will not be admitted in the Hostel. In case this fact is concealed from the authorities at the time of admission, the student's seat in the hostel will be cancelled as soon as it is discovered that she is suffering from a serious disease. Students are advised not to indulge in self-medication. If they do so they will be responsible for the consequences.
7. Roll Call—All students will report for Roll Call at 7.00 p.m. (Summers) and 5.30 p.m. (Winters).
8. Hostel rooms and premises must be kept neat and tidy. A best hostel trophy will be awarded to the best maintained hostel.
9. Habitual defiance of the hostel rules will render a resident student liable to disciplinary action, a special fine and even expulsion from the hostel.
10. Only parents/guardians will be allowed to meet their wards from 3.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. on Saturdays and 10.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on Sundays.

Appointment of a Local Guardian

1. Appointment of a Local Guardian is a must for admission to the Hostel. Parents should be very careful in appointing local guardians.
2. Male students (real brothers and cousins) will not be accepted as local guardians and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
3. Students (Men/Women) will not be accepted as local guardians. Parents must submit an application at the time of admission if they want a real elder brother/sister to act as a local guardian (with photographs).
4. In case of an emergency, local guardians will be informed.
5. The parents are advised to check the attendance, house test results, record of outings of their wards regularly.

Joining the Hostel

1. Resident students are expected to arrive a day before the academic term begins.
2. They are expected to bring their own bedding, bed linen, locks, tumblers, steel plates, a spoon, a bucket, a mug, a door curtain, a bulb and a Tube rod.
3. Furniture will be issued to the resident students against their signatures. Each student will be responsible for any breakage or loss of furniture issued to her. Before leaving the hostel, she must obtain a certificate from the warden that she has returned the furniture issued to her.
4. Hostel students are not permitted to use private electric appliances. In case of a defaulter, a fine of Rs. 100/- will be imposed and the electrical appliance confiscated. They are also warned not to tamper with electrical fittings. The college will not be responsible for any mishap.
5. The college does not take any responsibility of valuables (especially mobiles) and excessive cash of resident students. They are, therefore, advised not to bring jewellery with them. They should deposit money in the State Bank of India extension counter on the premises, in case of GCG-42–State Bank of Patiala, Extension Counter.
6. The college does not take any responsibility for any action of any girl which proves fatal or is detrimental to her social reputation.

Permission to Leave the Hostel

1. Students will not be allowed to leave the hostel before the official teaching is declared off. Prior permission of the Principal has to be obtained if any reservation for train/bus has to be done before the last day of teaching. Parents should ensure that they comply with the rule strictly and do not get reservation done before obtaining Principal's permission.
2. If parents want to give a permanent authority to their wards to leave the hostel for tuitions, day-out or home town trip, they must fill the specified form at the time of admission to the hostel and sign the register.

Outings

1. Sundays from 10-00 a.m. to 5-30 p.m. Festivals and any special Outing announced. Attendance will be taken at 5-30 p.m sharp.
2. Local guardian and Home Town visit- only on week ends.
3. **Official Holidays**—Students are allowed to go home on official holidays on the production of a permission letter from the parents and after submission of leave application. In case they extend the stipulated period of stay without informing the Hostel Authority within 24 hours, a serious action will be taken against them.

Facilities Available in the Hostels

Facilities like Fan, Record Player, TV and Geyser are available in the Hostels.

Food—Good vegetarian food at reasonable rates is served in the College Hostels. Students are required to dine in the dining room. No student is permitted to take food to her room without the special permission of Warden/Nurse. Students must be punctual for meals and must come properly dressed to the dining hall.

Laundry Service—Facility for washing and ironing of clothes is available on the premises on payment.

Telephone—STD/PCO is available within the hostel premises.

Dispensary for the Resident Students—There is a dispensary attached to the hostels. A nurse is on the premises to look after the resident students. In case of an emergency, a girl is to be taken to the hospital immediately.

Concession and Financial Help Given to the Students in Colleges under Eight Heads

The various concessions, scholarships and other facilities are as under :—

Half Tuition Fee concession is given to 10% of admitted students.

2. Half Fee Brother/Sister Concession

Students whose elder brother/sister is paying full fee in any Govt. College of Chandigarh Administration, should apply for concession within 15 days after getting admission in their respective college / same college.

3. Blind Students' Concession

All blind candidates shall be exempted from payment of tuition fees and admission fees in respect of all the examinations.

4. SC/ST Students—Books & Stationery

These students are given free books and stationery. All SC/ST students are eligible for books and stationery.

Under this scheme, the Education Department, Chandigarh Administration provides free books and stationery to each SC/ST student as under :

1. For Arts Rs.250/-
2. For Commerce Rs. 250/-.
3. For Science Rs. 350/-.

5. Non Hindi Speaking Scholarships

Object

The main object of the scheme is to encourage the study of Hindi in Non-Hindi speaking States and to make available to the Governments of these States, suitable personnel to man teaching and other posts where knowledge of Hindi is essential.

Under the Govt. of India scheme scholarships are sanctioned to the students from Non Hindi speaking States for Post Matric Studies in Hindi.

Five scholarships are given by the UT Chandigarh as follows :—

Rs.500/- p.m.for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Pass & Honours) I, II, III

Rs. 1000/- p.m. for M.A. I, II

6. Meritorious Students Scholarship

1. 21 scholarships are given under the UT Merit Scholarship Scheme.
2. 86 scholarships are given under the Govt. National Scholarship Scheme.

7. Poor/Needy Students

Economically Weaker Students (If the income of their parents is less than Rs. one lakh per annum) are given financial aid out of Students' Aid Fund & Red Cross Fund.

Note :—These concessions are not applicable for self-financing courses.

7. Award of P.U. Sports Stipend.

ACADEMIC PRIZES

To encourage better performance in studies, prizes are awarded to the students on the basis of their results in the house examinations subject to the following rules :

- (a) A student failing in the house examinations or seeking exemption on any ground, whatsoever, will not be eligible for the prize.
- (b) University prizes will be awarded strictly according to the position held by the students in the university examinations and notified in the Panjab University Gazettes.
- (c) The special examination, if held, will determine only the eligibility of the students for the University examination and is not for the academic prizes. However, if a student misses an examination in one or more subjects due to participation in National/ University competitions but secures a first/second/third position in the subject he/she has appeared for, he/she will be entitled to that prize.
- (d) Special prizes and certificates are awarded for distinction in co-curricular activities. The colleges also award Roll of Honour to the outstanding students for their achievements in the academics, co-curricular activities and sports.







ADMISSION TO M.A. PART I IN ARTS AND LANGUAGES

As per the Panjab University 'General Guidelines for Admission' booklet, the following procedure would be adopted for admissions to these courses :—

- In every College/Teaching Department of the Faculties of Arts and Languages which does not hold a separate entrance test for admission to M.A./Semester-I there should be two merit lists : first merit list consisting of those candidates who did their B.A. with the subject of M.A. and the second of those who did not study the subject of M.A. for their B.A. examination. The first merit list should be taken up first and the second merit list when the first merit list is exhausted. In case of M.A. English, students with Elective English should have secured at least 45% marks in the combined total of B.A. I, II and III. Students having General English should have secured 50% marks in the B.A. degree.
- Marks of other universities will be normalised to 2400 marks which are 3 years aggregate marks of B.A./B.Sc. (Gen.) of Panjab University. Similarly marks obtained by the candidates in the relevant subject will be normalised to 600 marks which is the total of 3 years aggregate marks of B.A./B.Sc. (Gen.) of elective subjects of Panjab University.

RULES & REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION, EXAMINATION AND AWARD OF DEGREE

1. Nomenclature of the Course

Bachelor of Physical Education A Four Year Professional Programme.

2. Duration of the Course

The duration of the course for the Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education shall be four years.

3. Intake of Students

50 eligible male students shall be taken.

4. Eligibility Conditions for Admission to Course.

A candidate who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible to join the first year class of the Bachelor of Physical Education. (B.P. Ed.) – A Four Years' Programme in the University / a college affiliated to this university:

- (i) Senior Secondary Certificate Part-II examination or +2 of recognized board / council / university with 45% marks in aggregate
- (ii) Certificate in Physical Education of two year duration with a minimum of 45% marks from any recognized university / institution on any other equivalent qualification recognized by the PU Chandigarh.
- (iii) The candidate should not be more than the age of 21 years on 1st Sep. 2005. However age may be relaxed upto 22 years in the case of National / International position holder sports student for the admission and for those who belong to recognized scheduled castes / scheduled tribes.

Provided that a candidate considered for admission under any of the above clause (i) to (iii) qualifies in the standard Physical Fitness / Efficiency Test at the time of admission to this course and scores minimum 45% marks in aggregate out of 60 marks of six test items.

- (iv) The merit for the admission to the first year of the Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.) shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination, fitness test with due weightage in the field of sports / NCC / NSS and proficiency in the game of choice etc. as per the guidelines of the Chandigarh Administration / Panjab University, Chandigarh.
- (v) The reservation policy will be followed as per the guidelines of the Chandigarh Administration (UT).

4.1 Eligibility Condition For Examination

A candidate shall be eligible to appear in examination in the first year of the Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.) who:

- (i) has been on the rolls of the University / College during the academic year preceding the examination.

- (ii) produces the following certificates duly signed by the Chairman of the Department / Principal of the affiliated college :
 - (a) of good character ;
 - (b) of having attended not less than 75 percent of the lectures in each class (theory and practical separately) delivered during the academic year preceding the examination;
 - (c) of having obtained 40 percent marks in Internal Assessment / marks to be awarded by the teachers on the basis of class test / practical assignments / project reports carried out by the student/s upto the end of the academic year.

4.2 A candidate who is declared pass in the first year examination conducted by the university shall be eligible to join the second year of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.)

- (a) The candidate/ shall be eligible to appear in the examination of the second year of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.) subject to the fulfillment of conditions laid down in clause 4.1.

4.3 A candidate who is declared pass in the second year examination conducted by the university shall be eligible to join the third year of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.)

- (a) The candidate/ shall be eligible to appear in the examination of the third year of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.) subject to the fulfillment of conditions laid down in clause 4.1.

4.4 A candidate who is declared pass in the third year examination conducted by the university shall be eligible to join the fourth year of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.)

- (a) The candidate shall be eligible to appear in the examination of the fourth year of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. Ed.) subject to the fulfillment of conditions laid down in clause 4.1.

5. Eligibility condition for migration of candidates from other universities

Any student studying in 4- Years' Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education in a College affiliated to a University whose standards and examinations are recognized as equivalent to the standards and examinations of Panjab University by the Faculty of Education, shall be eligible to migrate to any affiliated college to this university offering this course in the same class provided that:

- (i) the Principals and Registrars of the respective colleges and the universities respectively agree to such a migration.
- (ii) the vacant seat/s is/are available in the respective class/es.

6. Provision for Military Personnel / their Wards on transfer:

The provision is subject to satisfaction of conditions laid down in the clause 4 above.

7. Period for Completing the Course

No student shall be allowed to spend more than a maximum of 6 years in the entire Four Years' Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education.

8. Classification of Division of Marks

The marks obtained by the successful candidates shall be classified into divisions as under:

9. Grace Marks

- (i) A candidate who appears in all subjects of an examination and who fails in one or more subjects (written, practical, sessional or viva-voce) and / or the aggregate (if there is a separate requirement of passing in the aggregate) shall be given grace marks up to maximum of one percent of the total aggregate marks (excluding marks for internal assessment) to make up the deficiency, if by such addition the candidate can pass the examination. While awarding grace marks, fraction working to $\frac{1}{2}$ or more will be rounded off to a whole.

Provided that grace marks be also awarded to a candidate if by awarding such marks he can earn exemption or compartment in subject/s and part/s.

- (ii) A candidate who reappears to clear the compartment or subject/s and part/s in which he/she can be declared to reappear shall be awarded grace marks upto 1% of the total marks of the subject/s and part/s in which he/she reappears if by such addition the candidate can pass in that subject/s and part/s.
- (iii) The grace marks as admissible under the regulations be given to the candidates in the deficient subject/s in order to qualify for admission to higher course.

- 9.1 Grace marks upto 1% of the total marks of an examination including its part/s, if any, shall be added to the total marks secured by a candidate for the award of higher class (and not for earning distinction / honours); provided that no grace marks have already been availed of for passing the examination.
- 9.2 A candidate who reappears in any examination for purposes of improving the previous performance may be given grace marks upto 1% of the total marks of the paper/s or part/s as the case may be in which he / she actually reappears, for purposes of improvement of division and also for securing 50% of the total marks in these examination where such improvement to 50% marks is permissible under regulations; provided that no candidate shall be given more marks than the minimum that may be required for securing the higher division.

10. Chances to Appear as Late College Student

A candidate who has completed the prescribed course of instruction in an affiliated college for first year / second year / third year / fourth year examination but does not appear in it, or having appeared, fails, may be allowed to appear in the examination on the recommendations of the principal of the college concerned as a late college student, without attending a fresh course of instruction as follows:

Provided that the total number of years for completing the course remains within the limit of six years.

11. Number of Chances for Compartment Candidate/s

- (i) A candidate who obtains 40% of the aggregate marks in the individual subjects, but has failed in one subject obtaining not less than 20% marks in that subject, shall be permitted to appear in that subject at the next two consecutive chances of examination and if he / she passes in either of these two consecutive chances of examinations, he / she shall be deemed to have passed the examination.
- (ii) A candidate who is placed in compartment shall be eligible to join the next higher class provisionally. In case he / she fails to qualify the compartment subject within the two consecutive chances, his / her result for the higher examination will stand cancelled. For the compartment subject, he / she may appear as a regular student or as the college student.

Provided that a candidate for Bachelor of Physical Education Part-III examination, who fails to qualify the compartment subject in two consecutive chances but stands passed in Bachelor of Physical Education Part-IV examination shall be given two additional chances immediately next to the second chance availed by him/her. In case he/she fails to qualify in the compartment subject even in these additional chances he / she shall be declared fail and his result for B.P.Ed. Part-IV examination shall be cancelled forthwith.

12. Number of chances and period of improvement of performance / division.

A person who has qualified for the award of the four year Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from the Panjab University may be allowed to re-appear as a private candidate in a subject in which he appeared earlier, with a view to improving his/her previous performance. He / she may reappear in the first, second, third and fourth year examinations or any of the examination, simultaneously or separately.

For this purpose, he / she may be given two chances within a period of two years from the year of passing the fourth year Bachelor of Physical Education examination. He may avail of these chances along with next two annual examination.

13. Pass Percentage

The minimum marks to pass the Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education (first year, second year, third year and fourth year) examinations shall be 40% marks in each paper / part, theory as well as practical/s separately.

14. Attendance requirement

A candidate/s shall be eligible to appear in the annual examination in first / second / third / fourth year provided that he has attended not less than (i) 75% of the full course of lectures delivered to his class in each of the subject offered (the course to be counted up to the last day when the classes break-off / terminated for preparatory holidays) and (ii) 75% of the periods / lectures assigned to practical work.



RULES

1. Annual / Semester Examination System

- (i) The examination for the first year, second year, third year, and fourth year shall be held annually by the university on the dates fixed by the syndicate.
- (ii) For candidates placed in compartment, a supplementary examination shall be held on the dates fixed by the syndicate.

2. Appointment of Paper – Setters and Examiners

- (i) The examiners shall be appointed by the Board of Undergraduate Studies in Physical Education.
- (ii) For theory papers each question paper shall be set by the single examiner alone.
- (iii) Answer books shall be evaluated by the single examiner.

2(a) For the examination in practice of teaching and coaching (specialization), there shall be (i) a Board of three examiners consisting two external and one internal; (ii) the Head of the Physical Education Department of the University / College act as a coordinating examiner.

2(b) For the examination in Skill and Prowess (Practical examination), there shall be a Board consisting of three internal examiners appointed by the Principal / Head of the institution. The senior most teacher among them shall function as a coordinating examiner.

2(c) The duties of the coordinating examiner shall be; (i) to maintain uniformity of standard of awards in practice of teaching, coaching, practical examination in skill and prowess and Internal and External examiners ; (iii) to consolidate the results of each lesson or practical examination, and the internal assessment and send them to the university with the remuneration bill, etc.) When a set of examiners (External and Internal decide to award first class marks in a lesson or practical) to a candidate, the coordinating examiner (if not already present) will be specially called to watch the lesson. Final decision regarding awards in such cases and in all other cases of disparity and difference shall be with the Coordinating Examiner.

3. Internship

Internship of three months duration in the schools shall be compulsory in the fourth year of the Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education for all the candidates to qualify for the award of degree at the successful completion of all the four years of examination.

4. Syllabus

The Syllabus for the Bachelor of Physical Education –Four Years' Professional Programme shall be as prescribed by the Panjab University, Chandigarh.

5. Medium of Examination

- (i) The question papers shall be set in three languages i.e. English, Punjabi and Hindi.
- (ii) The medium of examination shall be English or Punjabi or Hindi.

6. Internal Assessment

- (i) Internal Assessment marks shall be as provided in the syllabus of the course / subject concerned which will be awarded by the panel of three teachers appointed by the head / principal of the institution concerned and submitted to the University after consolidation on the prescribed proforma.

The internal assessment attached with (i) subject / practical part and (ii) based on house tests shall be submitted to University on the prescribed proforma immediately on receipt of the university Roll Numbers and before the commencement of the examination.

7. Condonation of Shortage of lectures

A deficiency in lectures / practical / seminars / practice-teaching / coaching lessons / internship may be condoned as under:-

- (i) By the Principal / Head of the Institution if the deficiency in lectures attended is upto 15.
- (ii) By the Vice Chancellor / Syndicate if the deficiency in lectures attended is more than 15 and less than 30.

8. Last date for admission / examination form / fee

The last date for receipt of admission form / examination form and fee with and without late fee as fixed by the Syndicate from time to time shall be notified by the Controller of Examination.

9. Declaration of Result

The Controller of Examination of Panjab University, Chandigarh shall publish the result four weeks after the completion of the examination or as soon thereafter as possible.

10. Award of Degree

Each successful candidate shall be awarded Four Years' Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education.

Reservation policy

A candidate applying in a reserved category shall carefully indicate his/her claim for only one category. In the admission form. In case the candidate wrongly indicates claim for more than one reserved category, the one claimed in the first instance shall be considered. No change of category will be entertained /permitted in the application form or otherwise a later stage.

- a) **UT Pool:-**60% seats of the total sanction intake will be filled up from amongst the students who passed their qualifying examination from the Institutions recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the U.T. of Chandigarh as a regular student of said college/school subject to the condition that such student must have studied for two years at Chandigarh and have passed one lower qualifying examination from these colleges/schools. These seats will be termed as '**UT Pool**'.
- b) **General Pool:-**40% of the total sanctioned seats will be filled up from amongst the students who passed their qualifying examination from the Institutions other than those located in the Union Territory of Chandigarh or otherwise. These seats will be termed as **General Pool**.

- b) Sons/ Daughters/spouse of the Defence personnel and Para-military personnel like GRPF, BSF etc. who died while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- c) Sons/ Daughters/spouse of the Defence personnel and Para-military personnel like GRPF,BSF etc. who were incapacitated while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- d) Children /Widows of Defence persons killed or disabled to the extent of 50% or more in actions , wards of gallantry awardees, Ex-serviceman and children of serving Defence personnel / Ex-serviceman.

- e) Sons/ Daughters/Spouse of the Defence personnel and Para-military personnel like GRPF,BSF etc. who are wholly dependent on them.

Note:-

- i) The applicants seeking admission under categories (a) are required to submit the photocopy of citation for gallantry award failing which they will not be considered for this category.
- ii) The applicants seeking admission under category (b) and (c) are required to submit the certificate from the respective headquarters regarding death or being totally incapacitated while in service.
- iii) The applicants seeking admission to category (d) are required to submit discharge certificate from service and certificate of dependence from the Director, Zila Sainik Board.

The applicants claiming admission under category (e) are required to submit the certificate of dependence from the unit in which parents/Spouse is serving.

Children and Grand Children of Freedom Fighters.

2% seats from each pool will be filled from the children and grand children of freedom fighters.

- a) A freedom fighter is a person who has either been granted freedom fighter pension by the Chandigarh Administration or has been awarded "Tamra Patra" by the Govt. of India for his political suffering. No person other than the above mentioned persons will be considered as freedom fighter for the purpose of reservation of admission. The requisite certificate will be issued by the Deputy Commissioner of the District to which student belongs, which will be considered irrespective of the form in which it is issued provided it is self explanatory.
- b) Grand children means son's sons/ daughters or daughter's son /daughters. Wards of freedom fighters who have been awarded "Tamra Patra" by the Govt. of India would also be eligible for reservation under this category. In case of such freedom fighter they should produce their "Tamra Patra" certificate, freedom fighter certificate and dependence certificate from the Deputy Commissioner of the district in which they reside.

Note:-

The applicants from this category will not be considered without the following documents:-

- i) The photocopy of "Tamra Patra" certificate or freedom fighter certificate.
- ii) Dependence certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner.

Reservation of Sportsmen/ Sportswomen

- a) 2% seats would be filled with sportsmen or sportswomen on the basis of their merit as per the grading criteria recommended by Chandigarh Administration. This category shall not be divided in to UT pool/General pool . Benefits of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category of the students.
- i) Who passed their qualifying examination from institution recognized by Chandigarh Administration and situated in the U. T. of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said institution, who have studied in a Chandigarh institution at least two years before applying for gradation certificate subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh state etc. in the National /other recognized tournament.
- ii) Where Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other State/U.T.s on reciprocal basis to give benefit of reservation in admission in sports category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per the existing policy of Chandigarh Administration.
- iii) Countersigning of gradation certificate shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that counter signed certificate will be graded as per the policy of Chandigarh Administration.
- b) Performance in the following sports discipline will only be considered for the purpose of sports gradation certificates.

Students seeking admission to this category shall be considered only :

1. if/his/her age falls within the age group and is eligible for participation in inter-college/ inter university tournaments.
2. if his/her achievements in sports relates to his/her activities in any of the three years proceeding to the admission (eg. for admission in the year 2005-06 the achievements shall not be prior to April, 2002)

Reservation for other categories.

There will be no reservation for any other categories such as :-

1. Backward Class
2. Teacher's children, self and spouses.
3. Widow/Divorced / Deserted Woman.
4. Border belt/Backward area.

5. Children of innocent civilians killed/sustained 100% disability by terrorist/ security forces acting in aid of civil powers or children of victims of November, 1984 riots or children of any deserters killed /100% physically disabled or children of external/internal migrants or physically/challenged/incapacitated/mentally challenged.
6. Children /widows of Panjab police killed/disabled in action.

Foreign students.

2% seats are reserved for foreign students in 4 years' B.P. Ed. The foreign students should submit along with their application the following documents without which they will not be considered for admission under this categories.

- a) Eligibility certificate : if a student is seeking admission on the basis of foreign qualification.
- b) Long term students' visa.
- c) Proof of foreign nationality.

Note :-

1. Foreign students residing abroad should apply through their respective embassies to the Secretary, Government of India, Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi.
2. Foreign students shall have to comply with all the requirements of Government of India, Chandigarh Administration as well as Panjab University as prescribed by them time to time.

The reservation of seats given above shall be strictly adhered to. In case seats in the reserved category remain vacant on account of non-availability of the qualified candidates, such seats may be filled up from the general category. The candidate who had applied for a reserved category will be considered only for a particular category.

ORGANISATION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PHYSICAL FITNESS TESTS FOR ADMISSION TO B.P.Ed-Ist Year, Session 2005-06.

Test Item No. 1 : There shall be two lines marked parallel to each other at a 30 meters distance. As per command given by the tester the candidate is to cover the distance with minimum possible time.

Test Item No. 2: The candidate shall perform the standing Broad Jump on a take-off line drawn on the edge of the jumping pit. The candidate takes a position with toes just touching the take off line, feet slightly apart ; taking off feet simultaneously, he jump as far as possible, landing on both feet.

Test Item No. 3: The candidate holds the bar by his hands with forward hand grip & chins himself as many times as he can. In executing the movement, he should pull himself up until his chin is even with his hands, then lower himself until his arms are straight.

Test Item No. 4: Two parallel lines are marked at the distance of 10 meters. The candidate shall be required to repeat the same distance 4 times (up and down) continuously.

Test Item No. 5: The candidate will sit barefoot on the floor with the edge of the box or stair. From this position, he bends forward while keeping his knees straight and extend his hands along the scale as forward as possible and also hold the position for about 2-3 seconds.

Test Item No. 6: The candidate stands behind the starting line and on getting start signals he is required to make two rounds of 400 meters track to complete 800 meters distance in the shortest possible time.

3. Change of subject will be allowed only once on the availability of seats in the subject to be taken up.
4. **With regard to Functional English, Science, Commerce and other Arts subjects with practicals the students cannot appear privately. So they must ensure that they have 75% attendance in theory as well as in practicals and their academic conditions are cleared in the House Tests.**
5. No Candidate shall offer Mathematics unless she had taken up this subject in the previous examination.
6. Students who have not studied French earlier can take it up as an Elective subject in B.A.I as French is taught in this class right from the beginning.
7. Only those candidates can offer Physical Education as an Elective subject who have represented their school/ college in some game in the Inter-School tournament/ State tournament at 10+2 level.
8. Students who had not taken up Music (Vocal or Instrumental) in 10+2 class are allowed to take up the subject in B.A.I.

- (e) An associate of the (i) Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or England or (ii) Institute of Cost and Works Accountants of India or England ; OR
- (f) A pass in the final examination conducted by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India ; OR
- (g) Any other qualification recognized by the Syndicate for this purpose :

Provided that a candidate who seeks admission on the basis of qualifications mentioned in (c), (d), (e) above shall be required to qualify within one year from the date of Admission (either with Semester I examination or with Semester II examination) in a special examination in two papers on (i) Commercial and Taxation Laws, and (ii) Accounting and Auditing, in accordance with the Syllabus as may be prescribed by the Senate.

Further that the maximum marks shall be 100 in each paper and the pass marks shall be 35% as in B.Com. examination. There shall be no internal assessment in these papers and marks in these papers will not be counted for the Semester examination.
